Cameron Hall 'World Order' Session Guide

Leader at morning and afternoon general conference sessions of the "Christian Mission on World Order" will be Rev. Cameron P. Hall, who is director of the department of social education and action of the Presbyterian board of Christian education. The mission will hold day and evening meetings at the First Presbyterian church Wednesday, November 3. Other members of the mission team are Dr. Walter W. Van Kirk, of the Federal Council of Churches, Rev. Ernest Riggs, president of Anatolia college in Greece, and Judge Norris Bakke, justice of the Colorado supreme court.

The mission is being held during the month of November in 100 important cities of the United States to present the problem of applying Christian principles to the planning of peace. It is sponsored nationally by a group of Protestant religious bodies and locally by the Oregon Council of Churches and the Salem Ministerial association.

Mr. Hall has worked for a number of years promoting among Presbyterians better citizenship, improved international relations, temperance, and better race relations.

Prior to assuming his present post in 1939 he served as minister of two churches. From 1935-1939 he was pastor of the University Presbyterian church, Madison, Wis. In the previous ten years he was pastor of Christ Presbyterian church, New York City, where he faced daily the problems of bad housing, undernourishment, delinquency, lack of recreational opportunities and other community problems found in an under-privileged area with a mixed population.

A leader in world-wide religious activities, Mr. Hall is director of the youth council of the World Sunday School association at its quadrennial convention in Norway in 1936, a leader at the world conference of Christian youth and the World Student Christian federation conference held in The Netherlands in 1939.

Mr. Hall is a graduate of Williams college, Williamstown, Mass. After two years of study abroad at New college, Edinburgh, and Mansfield college, Oxford, Mr. Hall completed his theological studies at Union Theological seminary, New York.
