## RATION CALENDAR

**FOOD**  
Canned Goods - Blue stamps X, Y, Z valid until Nov. 28. Green stamps A, B and C in book 4 good through December 20.  
Meat, cheese, canned fish and edible fats - Brown stamp H valid today, good until December 4, and 7 good until October 20.  
Sugar - Stamp 29 in book 4 good for 5 pounds until January 15.

**SHOES**  
Stamp No. 12, book one, good indefinitely. Airplane stamp No. 1 valid now.

**GASOLINE**  
Book A coupons No. 8 now good for three gallons each.

Period 1 coupons in new fuel all rations valid through January 2. Coupons with gallonage printed on the face valid for amount indicated until expiration date shown on coupon sheet.

**TIRES**  
Cars with C ration books must have tires inspected every 3 months; B books every 4 months; A books every 5 months. Commercial motor vehicles - tire inspections every 4 months or every 5000 miles.

**STOVES**  
Purchaser must get certificate at ration board for new stoves.

Fuel dealers deliver by priorities based on needs.

## Dr. Caldwell, Educator, Dies

LA GRANDE, Nov. 6 (AP)—Dr. Verne V. Caldwell, Portland, dean and director of the general extension division of the state system of higher education, died in the hospital here Thursday. He was 46.

Caldwell, who collapsed in the Blue mountains shortly after bringing down an elk and deer, was rushed to La Grande Saturday for an emergency operation for ruptured gastric ulcers.

He is survived by the widow, Bessie, two daughters, and a son now in the marine corps.

Caldwell, a professor of psychology and education at Southern Oregon College of Education, Ashland for five years, and professor of psychology at Oregon College of Education, Monmouth, for eight, was appointed to his position as dean-director in 1940.

Funeral services will be held here Monday.
