

Flour Subsidy Boosts Wheat

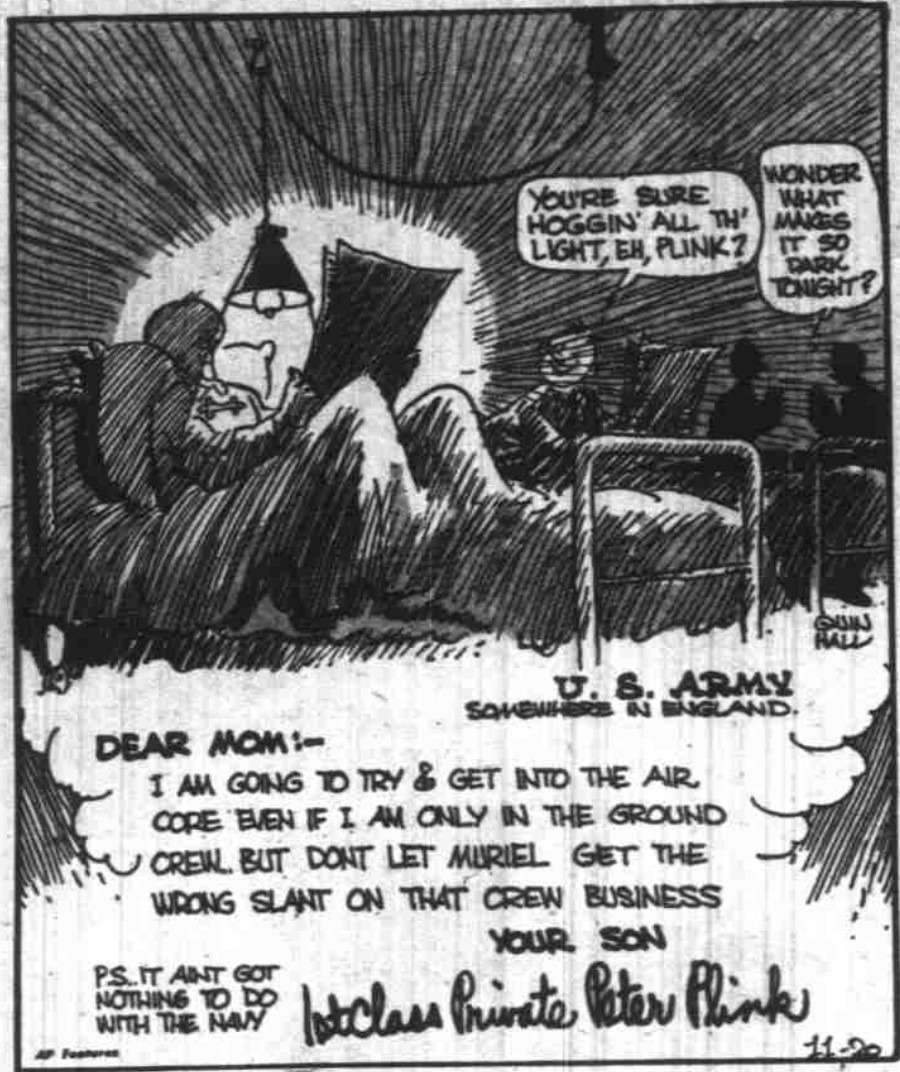
Rye Slumps, Recovers; Oats, Barley Gain Slightly

CHICAGO, Nov. 19 (AP)—Announcement of a flour subsidy program for millers and more reports on the poor condition of the southwest winter wheat crop spurred a good upturn in bread cereal futures today.

The flour subsidy plan, which has been awaited for the past few sessions, would permit millers to pay as high as parity prices for wheat. There was no concurrent announcement of ceilings on hard wheat, although this was expected shortly. Traders believed ceilings would be at parity, or about \$1.66 at Chicago.

At the close wheat was up 1/4, December \$1.61 1/4, rye was ahead 1/4, December \$1.14 1/4, oats were unchanged to 1/4 higher, December 78 1/4, and barley was 1/4 higher, December \$1.19 1/4.

Well Is Drilled

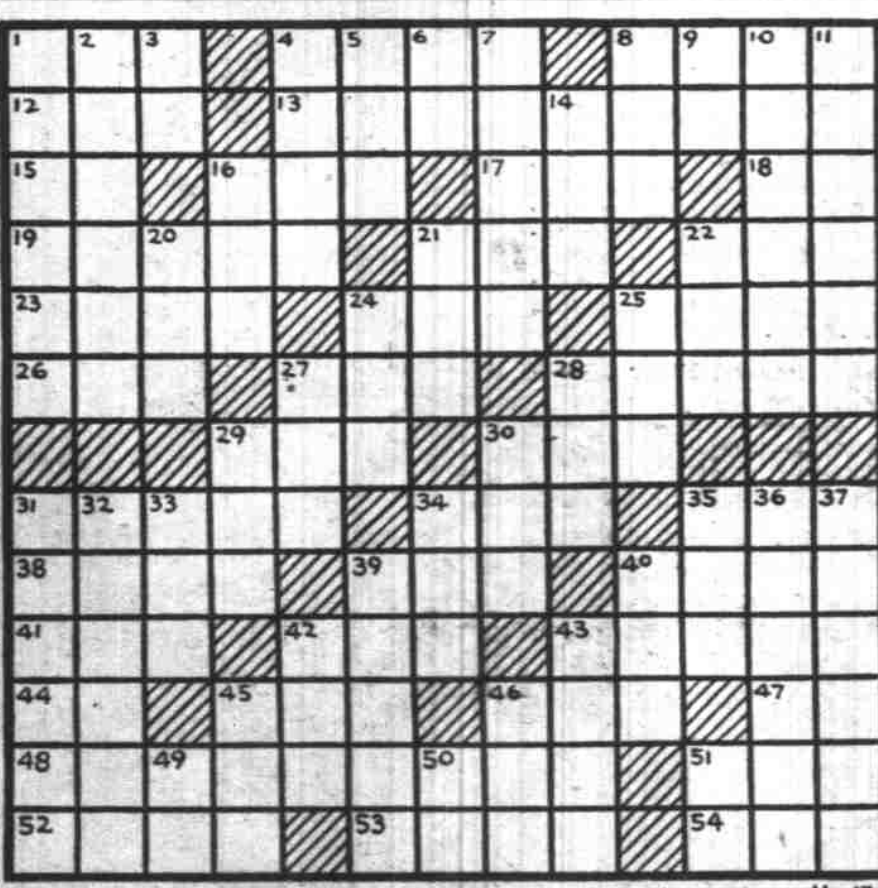
CLOVERDALE — The Herbert Kreiger family (on the Schmidt property) has completed the drilling of a new well and is installing an electric pump.
