Profit Taking Cuts Leaders

American Distilling Breaks Sharply, **Unsettling Others**

By BERNARD S. O'HARA NEW YORK, Dec. 13-(A)-Scattered favorites remained on the recovery side of today's stock market but profit taking cut down many leaders.

Prices began to wilt here and there after the opening and a sharp break in the recently buoyant American Distilling, which finished down 91/2 points at 1051/2, was an unsettling factor. Losses of fractions to a point or so predominated at the close, although oils and other assorted industrials managed to cling to small plus marks.

New Peaks Reached But Buying Light, Offerings Few

CHICAGO, Dec. 13-(AP)-Deferred deliveries of oats advanced as much as 2 cents today, reaching new seasonal peaks, on a small amount of buying which found the market with few offerings. Other grains, however, met profit-taking and generally displayed an easier undertone.
