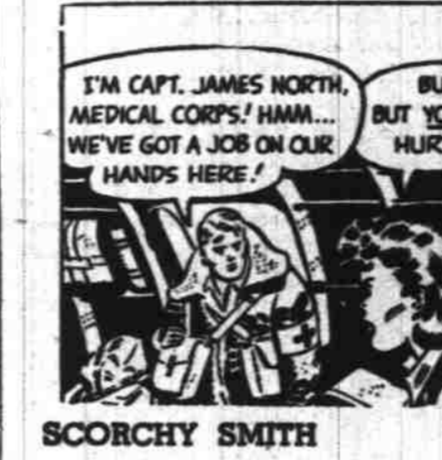
Woodburn Tops Its Bond Quota

The amateur show given at the Woodburn high school auditorium by the junior high school students drew a good house and proved good entertainment.

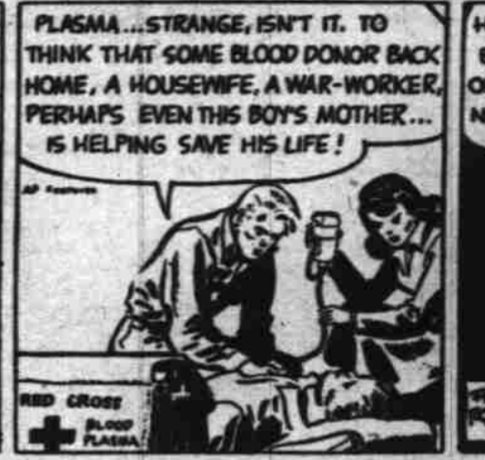

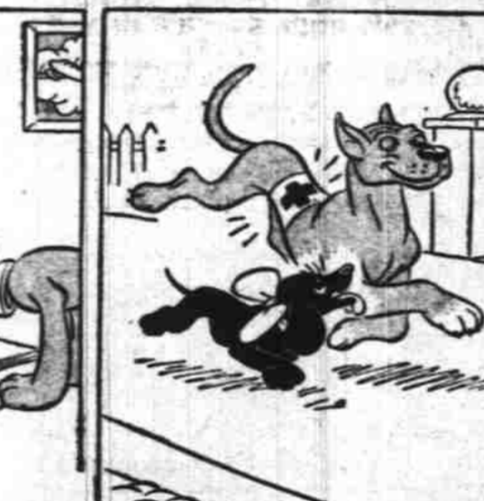
