- Pan roasted veal is going to be the very elegant main dish for Sunday dinner, and more simple dishes will go with it. TODAY Hamburger plate, French fries, Green beans, Olives-pickles, Apple pie. SUNDAY Pan roasted veal, walnut sauce, Fresh peas and new potatoes, Baking powder biscuits, Frozen strawberry shortcake. MONDAY Jellied tomato juice, Baked beans, brown bread, Buttered cabbage.

PAN ROASTED VEAL WITH WALNUT SAUCE

- 2 pound piece of veal, 1 small piece raw ham, 1 tablespoon shortening, Water to half-cover meat, 1 teaspoon salt, 1/4 teaspoon pepper, 2 tomatoes, diced, 1 small onion, sliced, 1 tablespoon minced parsley, 1/4 cup flour, 1/4 cup water, 1/4 cup walnuts, 1/4 cup raisins, 2 tablespoons chopped citron, 2 tablespoons sherry. Cut the ham into slivers. Pierce the veal at intervals with a pointed knife and insert the slivers of ham. Sprinkle the veal with salt and pepper. Melt the shortening in a heavy saucpan and brown the veal on all sides. Pour in sufficient boiling water to come half-way up the meat. Add tomatoes, onion and parsley. Cover and simmer gently for one hour, turn the veal over and continue simmering until the veal is tender, about another hour.

Remove meat to a hot platter and keep warm. Mix flour and water, beating with a rotary beater to avoid lumps and strain into the liquid in the pan. Stir until it boils and thickens, add walnuts, raisins, and sherry, and season to taste with more salt, if necessary, and pepper. Simmer five minutes. For four: garnish the meat with parsley and serve the walnut sauce separately. For six: slice the meat and serve in the sauce.
