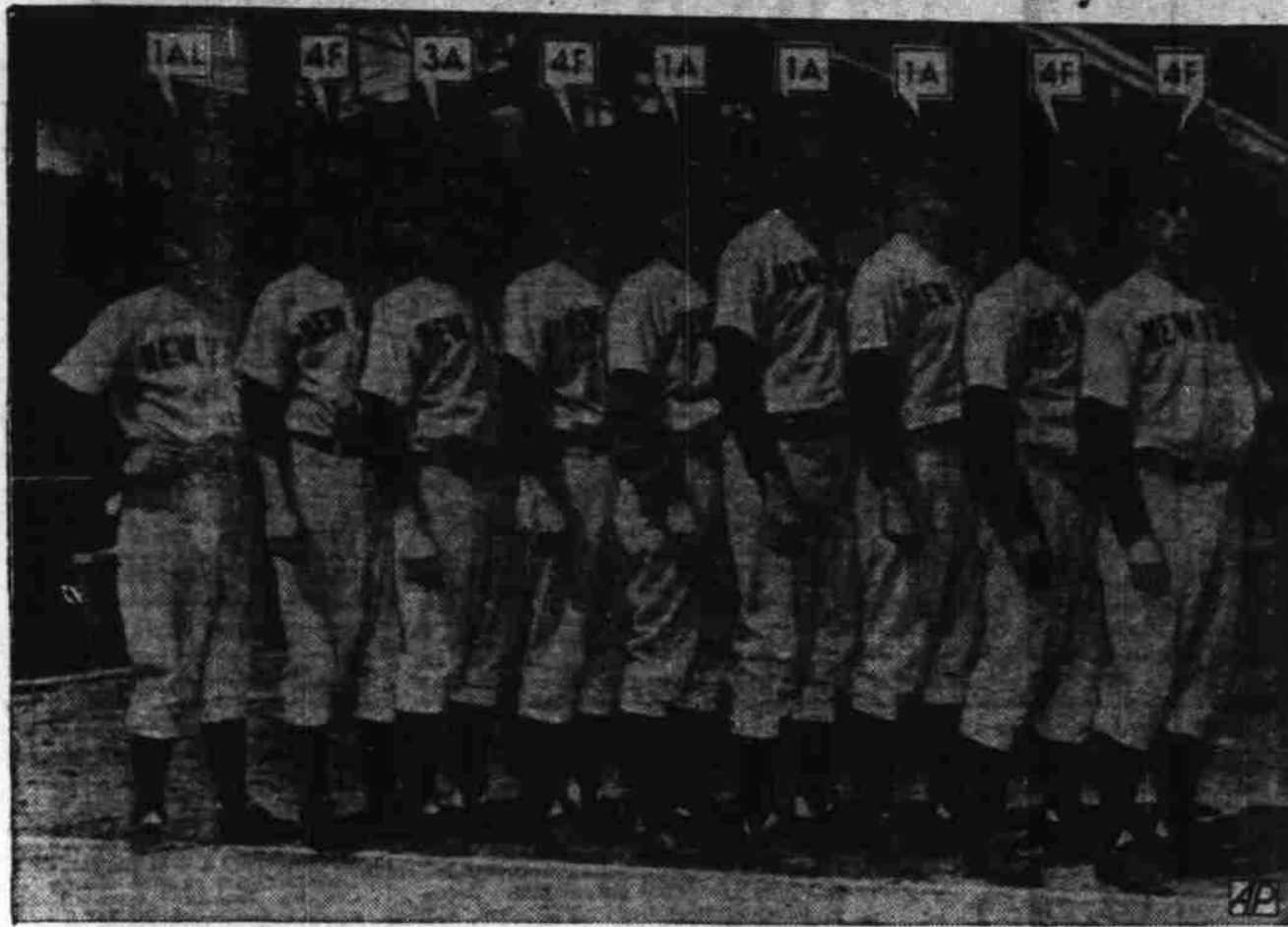


The New York Yankees—1944 Wartime Style

Estey Snares Thursday Golf

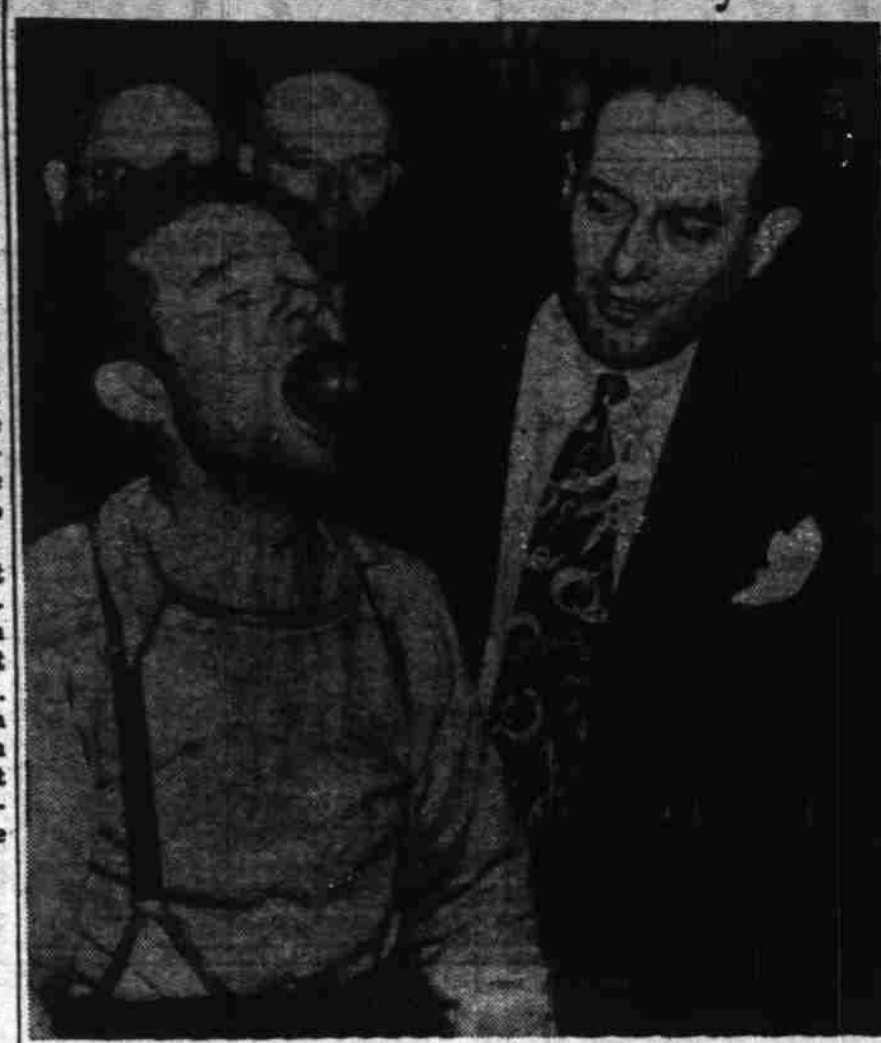

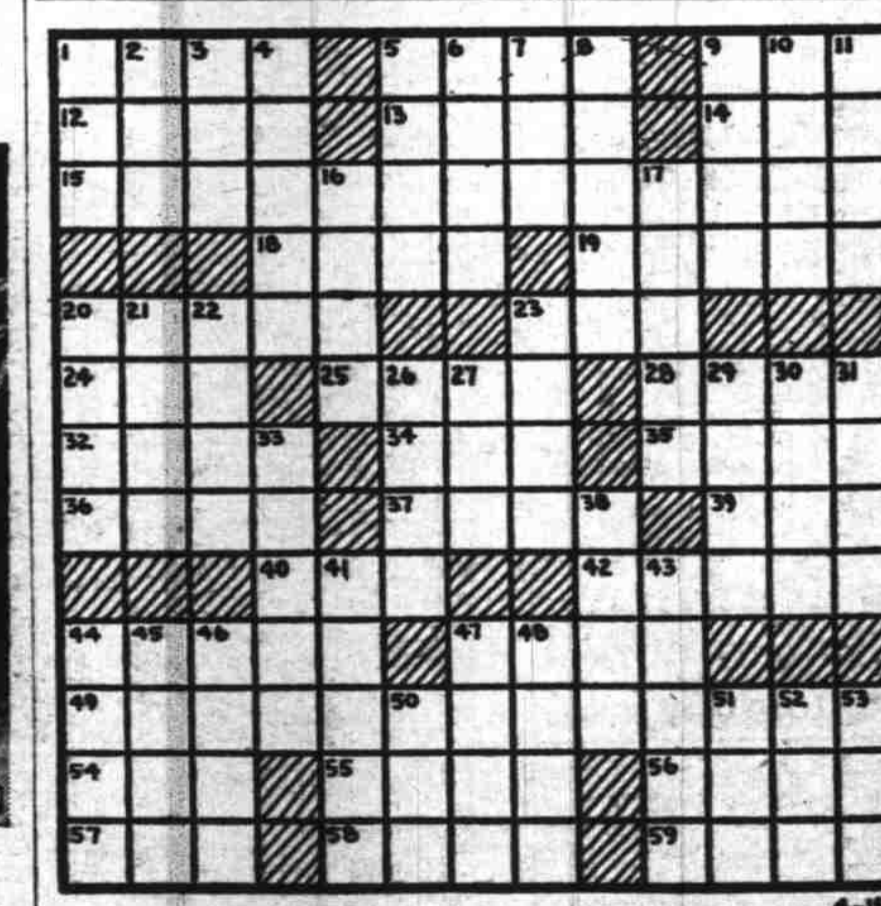
