

### Air Lines Make Applications For More Than 50 New Routes

WASHINGTON, April 27-(AP)—The civil aeronautics board opened hearings today on more than 50 applications for new air routes and permission to make additional stops on established air lines in Washington, Oregon, Montana, Idaho, Nevada and California.

The applications were filed by 21 airlines and individuals and were consolidated in one hearing to speed up testimony. The result of the hearings, before an examiner, will be reported to the board for decision.

The applications include: Oregon Air Ways, for lines from Portland to Marshfield and Portland to Klamath Falls; West Coast Air Lines, for ten routes in California, Oregon and Washington; United Air Lines, to include Salinas and Long Beach, Calif., and Klamath Falls, Ore., as stops on established lines; North Airlines, for lines from Seattle to Portland, Seattle to Victoria, B.C., and Butte, Mont., to Portland; South-west Airways company, for eleven routes in Washington, Oregon and California; Western Air Lines, for 10 routes in Washington, Oregon and California; Greyhound corporation, for permission to establish air service along the entire west coast; North Coast Transportation company, for lines from Seattle to Portland, Seattle to Blaine, Wash., Tacoma, Wash., to Bremerton and Blaine to Vancouver, B.C.; Pacific Northwest Airways, for 13 routes in Washington and Oregon; Washington Motor Coach company, for routes from Port Angeles, Wash., to Butte, Mont., from Ellensburg to Oroville, Wash., from Seattle to Bremerton and from Port Angeles to Victoria, B.C.; Landon-Jawson, Cleavinger, for lines from Seattle to Astoria, Ore., from Astoria to Crescent City, Calif., and Crescent City to San Francisco; Interstate Airlines, for routes from Pocatello, Idaho, to Pendleton, Ore.; Oregon Motor Stages, for four routes in Oregon; Albert L. Zimmerly, for routes from Spokane, Wash., to Los Angeles, Spokane to Idaho Falls, Idaho, and Missoula, Mont., to Seattle; Roy F. Owen company, for routes from Marshfield, Ore., to North Bend and from North Bend to Portland; Bremerton - Tacoma Stages, five routes in Washington and Oregon; John W. Foreman, for routes in Washington and Oregon and the Ryan School of Aeronautics, for routes in Washington, Oregon and California.

### Milwaukie Man Helps to Sink Jap Freighter

MARINE CORPS AIR DEPOT, Miramar, Calif., April 27-(AP)—In his first strike against enemy shipping in Simpson harbor at Rabaul, Marine First Lt. Robert D. Morris, 25, torpedo bomber pilot, of 1108 Main street, Milwaukie, Ore., assisted in sinking a large Jap freighter.

Lt. Morris, who has participated in 37 combat missions, recently returned to the United States after completing three tours of duty, which included the New Georgia, Bougainville and New Britain campaigns.

Describing the bombing raid on the enemy vessel, the leatherneck airman said: "Several ships were in the harbor and we dove through the heaviest ack-ack I ever encountered. I released my bomb at masthead level, scoring a direct hit amidships. When we pulled away to make our rendezvous, I could see the freighter belching fire and sending up a huge column of black smoke. Our squadron rang up three Jap ships to its credit that day."

Although he flew against tremendous opposition on ten missions over New Britain and was twice the target for attacking Zeros, Lt. Morris holds the distinction of never having received damage to his plane during combat.

### Lumber Dispute Gets New Hearing

PORTLAND, April 27-(AP)—A newly appointed war labor board panel will take additional testimony from the war production board and the war manpower commission regarding the northwest lumber industry wage dispute, union officials reported today.

Doyce F. Pearson, assistant secretary of the AFL Northwestern Lumber and Sawmill Workers' council, said he learned from Washington that Dr. Dexter M. Keezer, public member of the WLB, and former Reed college president, heads the panel.

Both AFL and CIO workers asked wage increases at a recent WLB hearing.

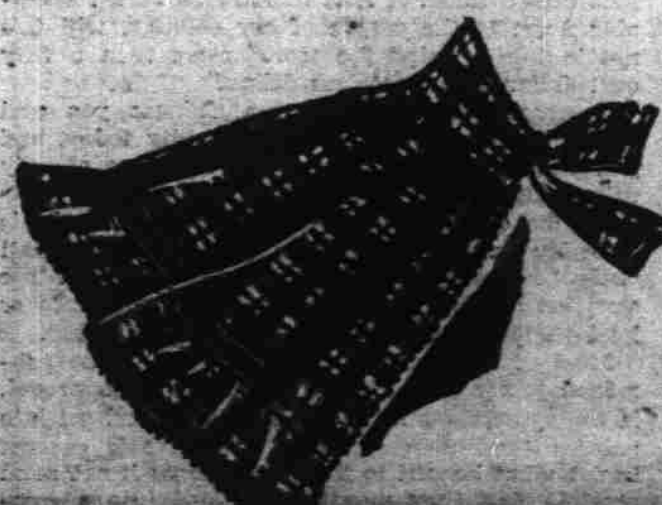
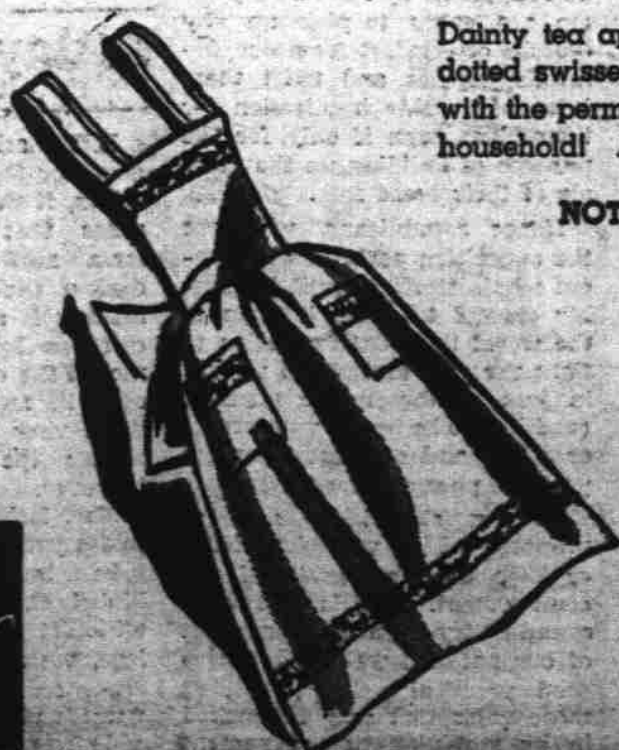
