Grains Make Small Gains

CHICAGO, May 3 -(AP)- Lifting of hedges in May rye futures by commercial interests pushed that delivery up a cent today and other sections of the grain market were firm in sympathy with rye. Gains were generally confined to fractions and, aside from the activity in May rye, trading was light.

Trading in all May contracts ends Monday, May 22. Open interest in rye at the end of yesterday's session was still large at 9,000,000 bushels.

May wheat, oats and barley held at ceilings. Active wheat futures closed 1/4-% higher, July \$1.70-\$1.70%, and active oats 14-% higher, July 79. Rye finished on gains of %-1 cent, May \$1.31-\$1.31%. There was no trading in barley.

There was little news available affecting 'wheat, although some buying was based on reports of improvement in flour business. About 125,000 acres of winter wheat have been lost in Missouri as a result of floods, the weather bureau reported.

By Quinn Hall ODT Removes **Shipping Rules** On Dry Onions

WASHINGTON, May 3-(AP) The office of defense transportation and the interstate commerce commission today eliminated the permit system controlling the shipment of dry onions from 12 principal producing states.

The two agencies set up system last September after the war food administration had certified that the suply of dry onions was becoming short and that control was necessary to provide orderly distribution.

With marketing of the 1943 crop now complete, WFA has revoked its regulation, permitting cancellation of the orders of the other two agencies. They had prohibited shipments of onions in excess of 100 pounds, except under WFA permits, in California, Colorado, Idaho, Indiana, Michigan, Minnesota, New York, Nevada, North Dakota, Oregon, Utah and Washington.

Stocks Enjoy Fair Advance

NEW YORK, May 3-(P)-Stimuated by a revival of buying interest in motor, rubber and steel issues the stock market enjoyed a fairly broad advance today. Closing gains in industrial lead-

ers ranged from fractions to more than a point. Final prices in some instances were a bit under the highs. The Associated Press 60-stock

composite rose .3 of a point to 51.6. Stock exchange transactions totaled 625,540 shares compared with 571,210 yesterday. Chrysler moved up sharply

closing 11/4 points over the previous final. Goodrich, Westinghouse, Oliver Farm and Caterpillar each improved a point. Dow Chemical and Park & Tilford showed wider advances but on relatively small dealings.


