Anthem "The Word of God Shall Guide My Feet" - Constant

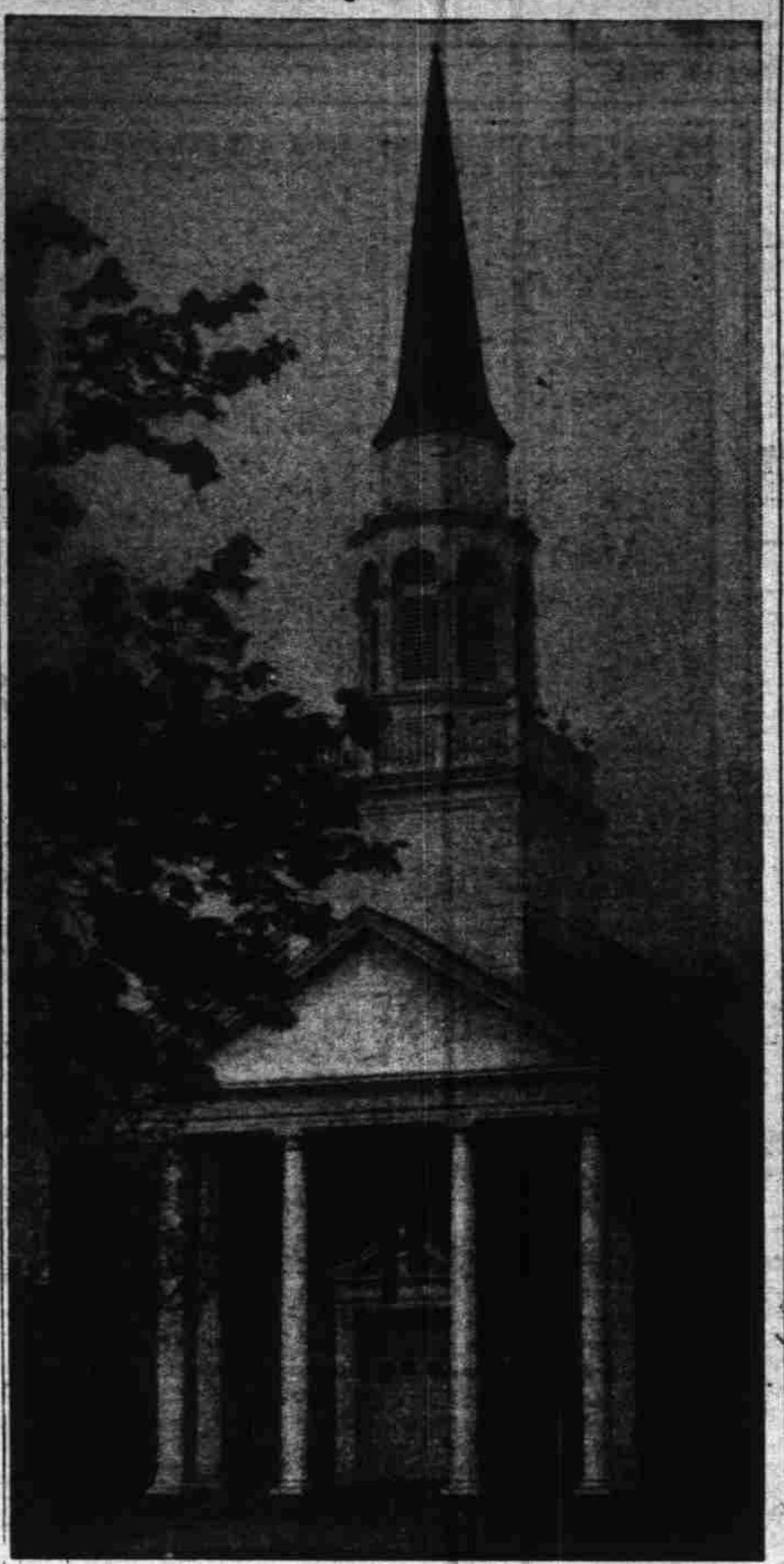
