## Has Slow Day

CHICAGO, June 8-(AP)-In the last few minutes of today's session, one of the slowest in weeks, trading in grain futures became fairly active but the markets were heavy and all prices were off at the close.

The lack of demand for wheat futures was apparent throughout the day and prices fluctuated nervously within a narrow range, influenced at times by small orders. After an early break caused by commission house sales, wheat showed fractional gains and held firm until near the close. Offerings were light.

The trade reflected the excellent condition of all small grain crops and the government's report of indicated yields as of June 1, to be released late Friday, was expected to be decidedly more optimistic than last month's.

Wheat closed 1/8 to 1/8 lower than yesterday, July \$1.59½. Oats were unchanged to % lower, July .741/4-1/4. Rye was off 1/8 to 11/8, July \$1.05-1.05%. Barley was 1/8 higher to % lower, July \$1.18%.

The break in rye followed a mid-session rally which had pushed prices around 11/2 cents above the day's low. Trade in the rye pit was relatively quiet and prices were easily influenced. Traders regarded the reported opening of a new Russian offensive as perhaps indicating the war with Germany would end sooner than anticipated, and prices eased. There was no improvement in the cash situation and only scattered sales were reported.


