Aerial Board Sets Hearing On Expansion

A formal hearing on the numerous applications for expansion of air transportation to small Pacific coast cities and towns will be held before the Civil Aeronautics board on August 1, according to advices received here Monday. There are approximately 20 applicants involved in the consolidated hearing, including existing air carriers who wish to expand their routes, surface carriers who have asked for permission to conduct air operations, and new aviation companies petitioning for extensive feeder air-line systems.

The board has not yet determined the place at which the hearing is to be held, according to Southwest Airways, one of the pioneer feeder line applicants. James G. Ray, company vice president, reported: "There is a very good chance this hearing will be held in some large city here on the Pacific coast."

Salem Airmail Service Better

With the nation's airlines operating the greatest number of transcontinental flights in their history, there has been a substantial improvement in air mail service between Salem and other major cities throughout the continental service which carries the heaviest mail loads, it was disclosed today by C. P. Graddick, director of United Air Lines air cargo department. The announcement coincided with inauguration of various new services by numerous airlines following the return of additional equipment from military service.
