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Swegle School Plans Annual Meet Monday

SWEGLE — The annual school meeting of this district will be held Monday night in the school auditorium at 8 o'clock. The budget as posted will be voted upon and one new director elected for a three-year term and a clerk for one year.

Menno Dalke is the retiring director this year.

There are few changes in the budget from last year, the teachers' salaries are somewhat higher, general control of the school will be only \$4 higher; fixed charges are the same; bond interest is less as the bonded debt is lowered a thousand dollars a year; maintenance and repairs is higher as work on the roof of the building has not been done and is very necessary.

A sum is to be put aside for a sinking fund to be used only after the war and when such repairs as painting may be done at less cost, it is planned.

For the benefit of the many new residents living in the district, the school law gives the privilege of voting on the budget to all whose name are now on the tax records. One may vote for director and clerk if he has lived in the district at least 30 days immediately preceding the election and is 21 years old.
