

Newton Rites To Be Friday

Independence Funeral Service Today at Mortuary

INDEPENDENCE — Funeral services will be held for Guy Alexander Newton at the Smith Baun chapel Friday, July 7, at 2:00 p. m. with Rev. W. A. Elkins officiating. Burial will be at Albany.

Guy Newton was born March 29, 1875, in Oakland, Iowa, and came to Oregon with his parents in 1903. He died July 3, at the Veterans' hospital at Portland.

Survivors are the widow, Rose, and children, Mrs. C. O. Spears, Richmond, Calif.; Mrs. J. W. White, San Francisco; Mrs. Clay Fox, Salem, and David Albright, Corpus Christi, Tex. Also two grandchildren of Albany. His mother, Mrs. Minnie Newton; sisters, Mrs. C. O. Sloper and Mrs. Gus Fisher of Independence; brothers, Gideon and Francis of Independence, Glen of Portland, Sidney of Yakima, Dee of Medford, Gerald of Ashland, Norman of Pyote, US army air corps, Tex., and Warren W. Newton Jr. in England.

Guy was a veteran of World War I. He was a member of the American Legion post at Newport and had just transferred from the Monmouth post. Since the age of 15 years he has been a member of the Christian church.

He was telegraph lineman out of Independence, Dallas, and Falls City from 1921 to 1924, and superintended the construction of the telephone lines in the Situla area near Yachats in 1937 and 1938.

After returning from California where he lived for a number of years his home was near Monmouth. He and his family had just recently moved to Albany where he was living at the time of his death.
