Traders believed yesterday's advances were sufficient to discount the bullish news that the war food administration had increased from 85 to 90 per cent of parity the wheat loan rate.

Some uneasiness also was attributed to reports that prices paid by the commodity credit corporation for wheat would not be affected by the increase in the loan rate. Current CCC purchases are made on the basis of six cents over the old loan rate.

At mid-session there was some buying by commission houses but the market showed no rallying power and the deferred contracts closed at new lows for the day. At the close wheat was 11/4 to






