

Lt. Kelso Is Awarded DFC For Bombings

AN EIGHTH AIR FORCE LIBERATOR STATION, England—The Distinguished Flying cross for "great courage, coolness and skill" as bombardier on at least 32 missions over Europe has been awarded Lt. Richard G. Kelso, son of Eliza E. Kelso of 1091 Elm street, Salem.

Lt. Kelso's citation mentioned "extraordinary achievement" and said he reflected "the highest credit upon himself."

The lieutenant, who also holds the air medal with five clusters, is credited with shooting down two F.W. 190s, one of which was making a head-on attack on the Salem man's bomber and the other of which had just damaged his plane's nose turret so badly the lieutenant's flak suit was ripped off in the 190-mile slip stream.

Lt. Kelso said his closest call was "on my third mission when a piece of flak came through the turret and missed my head by inches—then lodged itself in the co-pilot's boot."

Ramp Dies Sunday; Rites Set for Today

BROOKS — W. Howard Ramp, 59, native of Brooks, died at his home here Sunday morning. Although he had retired a few years ago from active management of his store, he had remained active and his death, following a heart attack, was unexpected.

He was a member of Fidelity lodge, A.F. & A.M. and Eastern Star of Gervais, Al Kader Shrine of Portland and the Salem Elks lodge. He had been a member of each for about 33 years and always took an active interest in the work.

Funeral services will be held today (Tuesday) at 1:30 p.m. from the chapel of the W. T. Ridgion Co., Rev. Dudley Strain officiating. Concluding services will be at Belcrest Memorial park under auspices of the Gervais Masons.
