Book 4 - Blue stamps A8 through Z8 F3 valid indefinitely.
MEAT, BUTTER, FATS & CHEESES:
Book 4 - Blue stamps A8 through D3 valid indefinitely.
SUGAR:
Book 4 - Sugar stamps 30, 31 and 32 valid indefinitely, 3 pounds each. For canning only: Sugar stamp 40 valid for 3 pounds. Apply at local OPA board for more.
SHOE Laces Stamps (valid):
Book 3 - Airplane stamps Nos. 1 and 2 valid indefinitely.
GASOLINE:
"A" No. 12 valid through September 21, 3 gallons each. "B" 3 or "C" 3 may be renewed within but not before 15 days from date on cover.
FUEL OIL:
Period 4-3 coupons valid through September 30. Fill tanks NOW!
TIRE INSPECTION:
Records must be presented for gasoline renewals, special applications, and tire replacements.

Large Forest Area Set Aside

SWEET HOME, Aug. 12—Dedication of 3000 acres of Oregon forest land Saturday brought to more than 500,000 acres of privately owned forest lands in the state and 8,000,000 in the United States.

More than 100 Oregon lumbermen were present here Friday night when Ellsworth Harris, Oregon congressman from Roseburg, dedicated the newest tree farm. It is located along the Santiam river in Linn county. Owners of the land are Lebanon Lumber Co., Powers Davis Lumber Co., and Santiam Lumber Co.

AUMSVILLE—Mrs. T. C. Mountain was stung by a bee when she went to a peach tree in their back yard Thursday to pick ripe peaches. Cordon OK's George Bill

WASHINGTON, Aug. 12—(AP)—Sen. Guy Cordon (R-Ore) declared today that handling of unemployment compensation should be left to the states rather than the federal government. He went on record as favoring the George bill which would place unemployment payments under state authority.

Cordon listed the shortage of heavy lumber truck tires as one of the northwest's principal current problems. He predicted a 25 per cent drop of lumber output within 30 days and a 50 per cent drop in 60 days unless tire production is increased.

George Wilson Dies Saturday

SILVERTON, Aug. 12—George Wilson, a retired painter, died in the hospital here Saturday morning. He had been a resident of Silverton since 1910 coming here from the middlewest. He was born in Iowa, October 9, 1868. He retired several years ago because of his health.

I. B. Warden Dies in Tacoma

SILVERTON, Aug. 12—I. B. Warden, 70, retired railroad man, died at a Tacoma hospital Saturday. He had lived for many years in Silverton where he owned considerable property.

Mrs. Warden was in Tacoma with him for the last week having been called there when he became seriously ill. There are no children. The body will be brought to Silverton for burial and Ekman's mortuary will be in charge of arrangements.

Cattle-Killing Bear Killed

MEDFORD, Aug. 12—(AP)—A crippled cattle-killing bear for which Dutchman Peak cattlemen have been hunting for years was off the public-enemy list today. The 600-pound bruin was shot yesterday by L. L. Lewis, government hunter, after his dogs treed the animal in a dense thicket. Lewis was forced to crawl through underbrush to within a few feet of the bear to fire the fatal shot.

A long-standing reward had been offered for the brown bear, which began eating cattle years ago—its predations unchecked by a former bullet wound in the left hind leg.
