

Hoover Says Dewey, Bricker Have Chance

EUGENE, Ore., Aug. 26 (AP)—President Herbert Hoover, here after five days of fishing the McKenzie river, predicted today that "Mr. Dewey and Mr. Bricker can be elected if the republicans work hard."

But he side-stepped other questions of a political nature, preferring to talk about angling.

He recalled his boyhood days on the Santiam river "when fishing was fishing and if you did not get up to 60 fish a day you did not amount to much as a fisherman."

The former chief executive, who was 70 this month, appeared in excellent health. He will leave tomorrow for Palo Alto, Calif. With him are his son and daughter-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. Allan Hoover, and Mr. and Mrs. A. C. Mattie of San Francisco.

Energy Flows From Coulee

GRAND COULEE, Aug. 26—At the power plant of Grand Coulee dam, the world's greatest concrete structure, produced during the year ended June 30, electrical energy equal to the 1921 output of all plants on the Pacific coast, the bureau of reclamation reported today.

Bureau engineers said the production of 5,800,000 kilowatt-hours was double that of the preceding year.

In March, 1944, the plant produced what was announced as a world's record for power generation during a single month by any hydro plant. The total that month was 621,000,000 kilowatt-hours.
