Energy Flows From Coulee

GRAND COULEE, Aug. 26— At the power plant of Grand Coulee dam, the world's greatest con-crete structure, produced during the year ended June 30, electrical energy equal to the 1921 output of all plants on the Pacific coast, the bureau of reclamation reported today.

Bureau engineers said the pro-duction of 5,800,000,000 kilowatt-hours was double that of the preceding year.

In March, 1944, the plant produced what was announced as a world's record for power generation during a single month by any hydro plant. The total that month was 621,000,000 kilowatt-hours.
