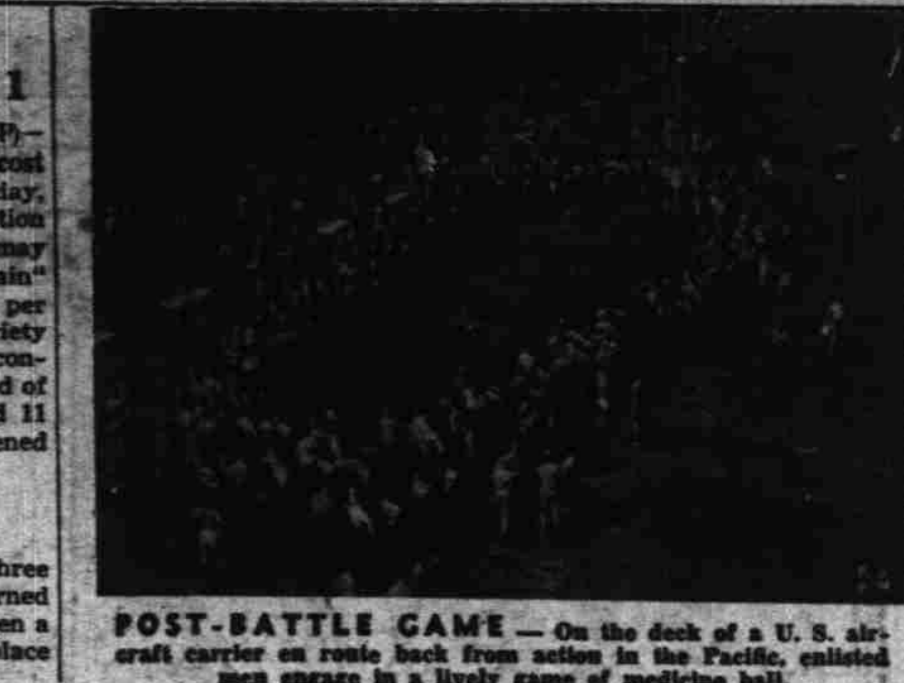
Logging operations in the Scio area were suspended Tuesday when humidity in the woods dropped below the minimum of 30 deemed safe from fire hazards.

'Chaw Terbaccy' Will Cost More September 1

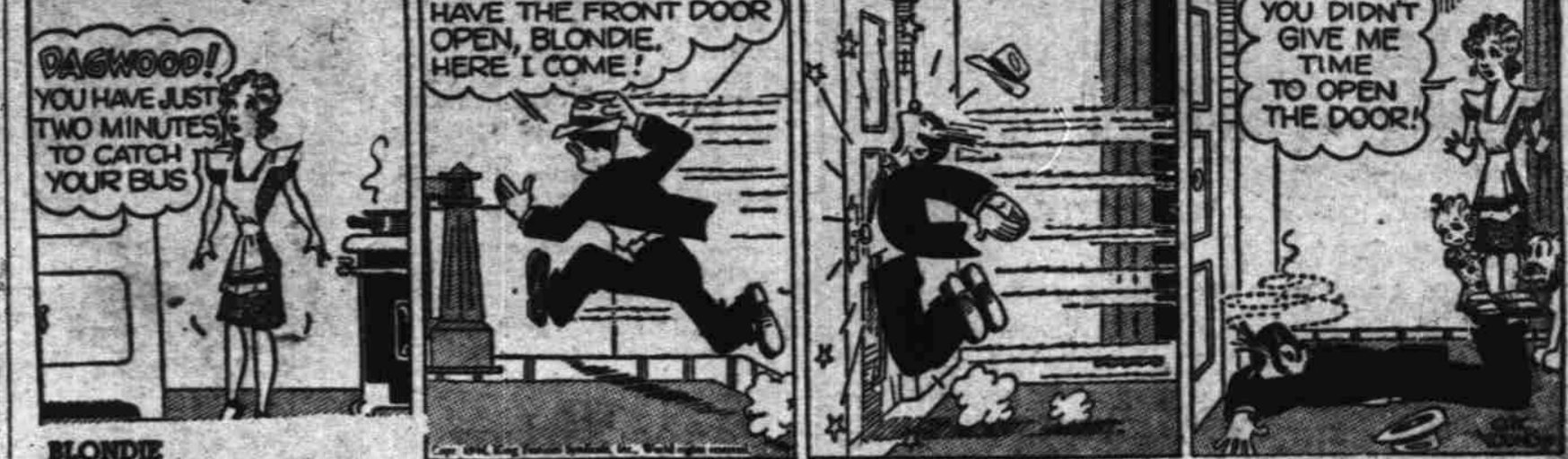
