Food Brands System OK'd

WASHINGTON, Sept. 7-(AP) Removal of the ban on government grades as a basis for setting price ceilings on the 1944 pack of canned goods would be "a very long step towards establishing government grades as the basis for commerce in canned goods," Representative Boren (D-Okla.) declared today.

He said in a statement that he has telegraphed "strong opposition" to such a move to Chester L. Bowles, OPA administrator, who recently proposed the ban be removed.

Boren is chairman of a house interstate and foreign commerce committee investigating compulsory standardization, restrictions on the use of brand names, and newspaper restrictions.

Boren told Bowles that "your plea" for lifting the congressional ban on the use of government grades "flies in the face of testimony taken by our committee."

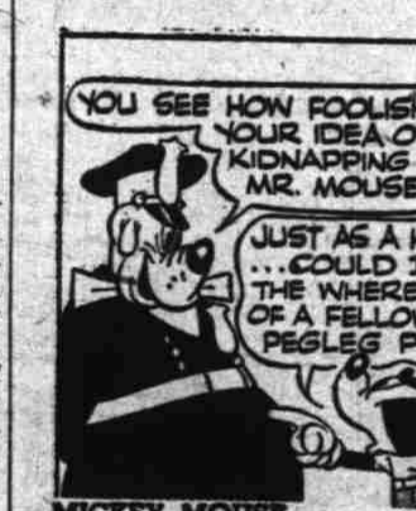
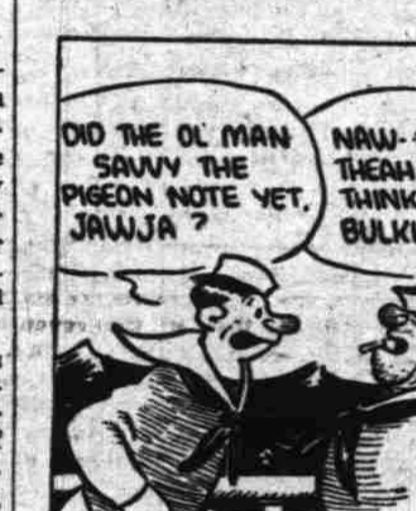
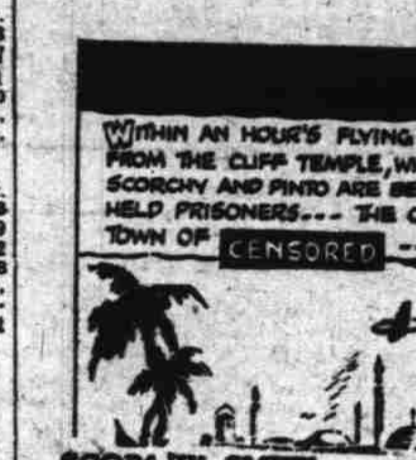
