It was a thriller in contract to yesterday's 2-1 victory, won by the Browns on two hits. Brilliant plays were frequent with Marion making several seemingly impossible

Thirteen Brownies went down via the strikeout route, six by Lanier as he hurled one-hit ball for the first six innings and seven by Donnelly. The 29-year-old Donnelly reached his greatest heights in the eighth when he struck out three of the four men to face him after Kreevich sent the chunky Lanier to the showers. Donnelly checked the Browns with two hits in the last four frames to become the winning pitcher.

With Verban on first as the result of a single, Lanier sacrificed. The ball popped into the air between the plate and pitcher's box. Potter barely got his hands on the ball, fumbled it and made a wild throw to first, allowing Verban to go all the way to third. Augie Bergamo, who replaced Danny Litwhiler in left field for the Cards. couldn't get the ball past second baseman Don Gutteridge but that was enough to let the fleet Verban cross the plate with the game's first run.

The Cards picked up the other unearned run in the Fourth. Mark Christman was guilty of another error that loaded the bases with only one out. A walk to Sanders and Kurowski's first hit of the series put men on first and second. The Browns' third baseman then fumbled Marion's hard grounder. Sanders rounded third for home but fell and scampered back to the hot corner. Verban sent a high fly to Chet Laabs in left and Sanders easily romped home after the catch.

That two-run lead appeared to be enough with the Browns at the mercy of Lanier, Marion's sensational stops cutting short anything that resembled a rally.

But the "Cinderella kids" showed some of the mettle that carried them to the American League pennant by tying up the count in the seventh. There was no indication of an uprising as McQuinn fanned to start the inning and Mark Christman fouled to Catcher Walker Cooper.

Gene Moore, whose single opened the Browns' victorious rally in the first game, singled to center. Weak-hitting Red Hayworth rapped a curve to the left field fence. That was good for one run. Frank Mancuso, also usually a weak hitter, batted for Potter and singled to center, scoring Hayworth with the tying run as the Brownies' supporters went wild.

The American league fans seemed squelched as Don Gutteridge grounded out to end the inning but rose up again as Kreevich lashed out with a double to open the eighth. Donnelly was called in to put out the fire and he did it by striking out Chet Laabs for the third straight time, fanning dangerous Vern Stephens and also Christman after walking George McQuinn.

Billy Southworth, manager of the Cards, announced he would lead tomorrow with freshman pitcher Ted Wilks, who won 17 and lost 4 during the regular sea-Luke Sewell said he would send out Jack Kramer, veteran with a 17-13 record.

Odds on the Cards to win the series shifted to 9 to 20 as the result of today's victory with the National leaguers 3-5 favorites to take the third contest.


