

Thousands Visit Church as Tribute to Willkie

Persons An Hour Pass Beside Casket

Funeral Services To Be Held Today, Burial in Indiana

NEW YORK, Oct. 9. (AP)—Thousands of persons filed through Fifth avenue Presbyterian church today to pay final tribute to Wendell L. Willkie, 1940 republican presidential nominee, who died suddenly early Sunday morning.

An estimated 6000 persons an hour were entering the church, Acting Assistant Chief Inspector John W. Conway said at 3 p. m., and an estimated 3000 already had gathered at 11 a. m., when Mrs. Willkie entered the church to kneel beside the casket of her late husband.

Accompanied by Edward Willkie of Chicago, brother of the former public utilities executive, Mrs. Willkie entered the church, which had been cleared of all attendants and police for her arrival, and remained inside for two hours.

Following Edward Willkie's departure, shortly after noon, the waiting throng was moved back to Fifth avenue by Inspector Conway.

The family's decision to permit the public to view the body came last night as the result of hundreds of requests for public participation in the funeral rites.

Four Floral Tokens

Four floral tokens rested at the head of the massive bronze casket, while an American flag was draped at the foot.

The Rev. John Sutherland Bonnell, pastor of the church, who will conduct the funeral services at 3 p. m. tomorrow, announced that Mrs. Willkie had requested that no photographs be made in the church. The public will be admitted to the services after all ticket holders have been seated.

Son Returning

Burial will be in the family plot at Rushville, Ind., after the return of Willkie's only son, Lt. (jg) Philip Willkie, USNR, now on convoy duty in the Atlantic.

Throughout the day thousands of messages of sympathy from the great and the humble continued to pour into the Willkie Fifth avenue apartment.

The body will be taken to Rushville after funeral services tomorrow. It will be accompanied by Willkie's brother, Edward, and will go to Dunreath, Ind., by train and from there to Rushville by automobile.

Mrs. Willkie will remain in New York until the arrival of her son.

Pole Question One Cause of Churchill Trip

LONDON, Oct. 9. (AP)—An attempt to effect an agreement between the exiled Polish government and Soviet Russia was believed here to be one of the prime aims of Prime Minister Churchill's trip to Moscow today for conferences with Premier Marshal Stalin.

The dynamite-laden Polish dispute has been generating increasing acrimony and has been seized upon by the Nazi propaganda machine in its campaign to split the allies.

The journey of Churchill and Foreign Minister Anthony Eden to Russia came only a few days after an impasse was reached in British-backed efforts to reconcile the Polish exiled government led by Prime Minister Stanislaw Mikolajczyk with the Soviet-sponsored Polish national liberation committee.

Edstrom, industrial chairman of the Salem Chamber of Commerce, with Legal Warner and Manager Clay Cochran of the chamber; H. A. Brinkerhoff, project manager at the plant here; W. M. Staples, construction superintendent; Kenneth White, Columbia Metals engineer here; W. R. Seyfried, from the alumina construction project, and C. B. Stephenson of the First National Bank of Portland, joined the visitors for luncheon.

Dewey Pleased With Big Four Postwar Plans

ALBANY, N.Y., Oct. 9. (AP)—Gov. Thomas E. Dewey today endorsed the Dumbarton Oaks postwar security recommendations as "a fine beginning," but declared there still was much to be done to complete the structure "we plan."

In a statement issued after publication of the big-four plan for forceful preservation of peace, the republican aspirant for President Roosevelt's post said he was "very happy over the result."

Next Steps Due

"All peace-loving people must rejoice that we have found so large an area of agreement about world organization for peace," he said. "The unanimous recommendations open the way to the next steps."

"We must take advantage of that mood of common purpose to assure continuing unity for peace. This makes it important to act promptly rather than to delay in the search for perfection."

"We must not be discouraged or become disheartened if every detail is not immediately solved to perfection. The initial organization will in any event need to be perfected as we go along."

Shows Favor

Thus Dewey apparently sought to allay any fears that a change in administration would alter America's fundamental postwar foreign policy as enunciated at the recently concluded four power conferences in Washington.

The governor, who has been placing increasing stress lately on the international aspects of his campaign, was kept informed of conference developments through John Foster Dulles, New York lawyer, who acted as liaison agent between Dewey and Secretary of State Hull.

Aimee's Rites Draw Throng

LOS ANGELES, Oct. 9. (AP)—Aimee Semple McPherson made her last public appearance today, still exerting in death the strange, emotion-stirring power which brought her disciples by the hundred thousand during her 34 years as an evangelist.

The vast, flower-banked auditorium of her Angelus temple was filled to capacity with more than 5500 persons. In an adjoining auditorium 1,000 to 1,500 congregated, unable to see but hearing the ceremonies over a loud speaker.

Outside several thousand more persons were gathered, listening to the broadcast funeral services. And, on the highway viaduct a full block from the five-story radio-spired temple which was the center of her Foursquare gospel movement, another crowd of several hundred listened to the faint voices from the distant loud speakers.

Leningrad Lights On

LONDON, Oct. 9. (AP)—Street lights have gone on again in Leningrad, Russia's northern metropolis besieged so long by the Germans, said a Moscow radio broadcast heard here tonight by the soviet monitor.

Thumbnail Of War!

Western Europe — Aachen almost surrounded, only fire-raked mile and a half gap left as escape route for nazis; Canadians land back of enemy line in Holland; allies advance in other sectors.

Russia — Russians advance in Lithuania to within 12 miles of Memel, East Prussian seaport, and push westward from the Polish corridor to three miles of East Prussian border; cross Tisza river in Hungary, last major obstacle in drive toward 50-mile distant Budapest.

Italy — Americans within 10 miles of Bologna, as Germans thrown in more troops to stem advance.

Greece — Allied headquarters draws curtain of secrecy over invasion of Greece, after British report Germans fleeing.

Pacific — Allies land on another Palau island; Zebuanga, Philippines, and Balikpapan, Dutch Borneo oil center, among points hit by allied bombing; American fleet shells Marcus Island.

China — Japanese temporarily halted about 25 miles north of their objective, Kweilin; Tokyo says 23 American superfortresses destroyed in raid on American base near Chengtu; allies predict junction of Ledo and Burmo roads.

Nazis Commit Another Pair of Lidices, Claim

NEW YORK, Oct. 9. (AP)—The massacre of Lidice has been repeated in two more Czechoslovak villages, the Czechoslovak information service in London has announced, according to NBC short wave monitors.

On Oct. 4, the hamlets of Solnaa Bama and Huilck, in Slovakia northeast of Presov and not far from the present battleline, were completely obliterated by the nazis and their inhabitants were slaughtered, the information service reported.

Saturday is the last day on which Christmas mail may be posted to service men overseas since October 15, the final date, falls on Sunday. The postoffice will be open Saturday afternoon to take care of all persons with packages to mail. Miss Tye's office will not be open Saturday afternoon.
