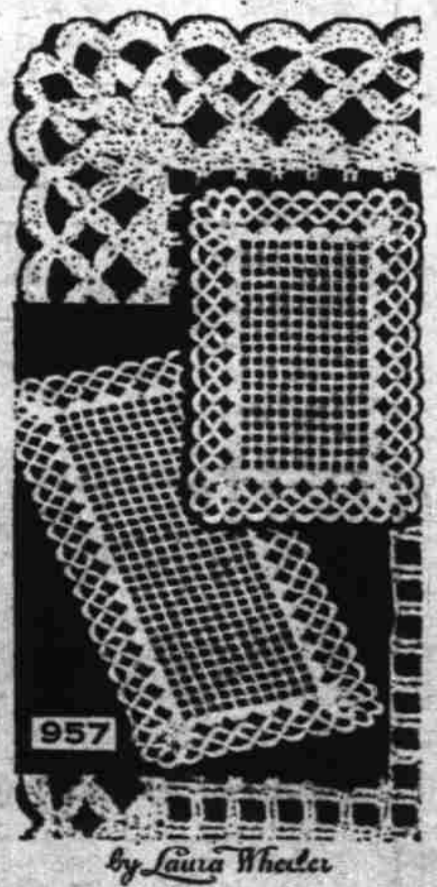


Prevention Of Fire Urged

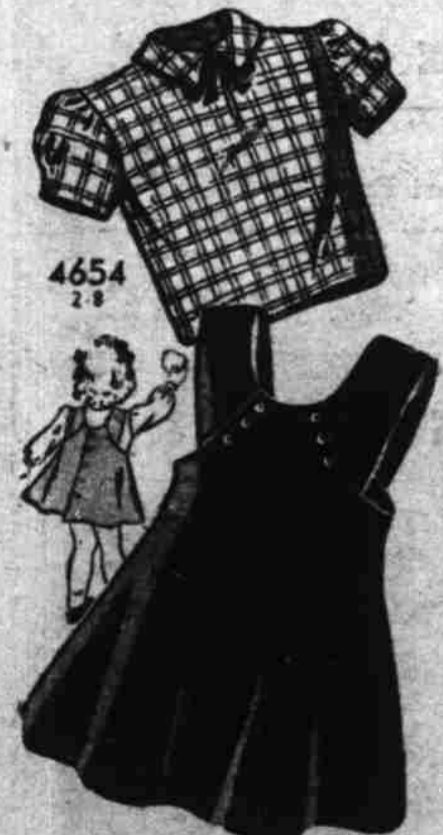

All right, so this is fire prevention week, though a day or so of heavy fall rain has put out all the fires, even the piles of burning leaves and the slashing fires up in the hills.
The war, with its hundreds of members of the aircraft warning service, curtailment of automobile traveling and a general feeling of responsibility among citizens, has proved that forest fires are practically preventable.
That's why we can celebrate fire prevention week with a clear conscience. We know that few forest fires were reported this year, comparatively little damage done to our Oregon trees.
Fire, say the experts, lurks in dry airless, dusty places, so it's wise to air out the attic and if papers and rags have accumulated—to get rid of them. Fire is never an inexpensive affair, so watch out for it carefully.
Oily mops and dust cloths often ignite themselves and also should be watched for possible fire. Hang them carefully up so they air out.
Although a fire extinguisher is

not exactly a handsome ornament for the livingroom, it would be a utilitarian spot for it. However, an extinguisher should be placed where all members of the household know about it—and there should be one on each floor, especially the attic and basement.
Home dry cleaners are a race of women who take their lives in their hands. Many a woman has proudly boasted that she cleans her clothes in gasoline in the basement—she never seems to worry about a hot furnace nearby. Once I knew a woman who heated her gasoline over a gas burner in the basement—she doesn't do that any more, and she was a smart enough woman too, just didn't have good judgment.
Careless disposal of ashes from the furnace, lack of care in handling cigarettes and of matches, and incorrect storage of gasoline in the garage often cause great fire damage around homes.
Humorously enough, fire prevention week has been set for years during the week October 9, the anniversary of the great Chicago fire.
