Anti-Franco's Slate Meeting

LONDON, Oct. 27—(AP)—Spanish republicans will confer Nov. 2-4 in the French city of Toulouse, only 60 miles from the Spanish frontier to "decide upon the best methods" of overthrowing Generalissimo Francisco Franco's falangist regime, republican headquarters here said yesterday.

A Paris dispatch disclosed that for the first time since the outbreak of the clashes along the Franco-Spanish frontier, a Paris newspaper, France Libre, has taken up the defense of the Franco regime.

"France no longer has anything against Franco," said an editorial in France Libre. "Let us admit in good faith that Franco was under obligation to Hitler and Mussolini for their recognition and support; he paid only in words."

Finns Charged With Crimes

STOCKHOLM, Oct. 27—(AP)—Arrest on war crime charges of 100 Finns including four generals, most of them connected with the administration of eastern Karelia before it was yielded to the Russians, has been demanded by the allied (Russian) armistice commission, a reliable Stockholm source said today.

Maj. Gen. A. Pajari, who recently commanded Finnish troops fighting the Germans in the Tornaa river valley, and Maj. Gen. P. Palojarvi, commander of Finnish forces in Kahumaki sector, already have been arrested, Helsinki advices said.

MOSCOW, Idaho, Oct. 27—(AP)—Lt. Frank Kara, who held the national collegiate boxing championship in the 127-pound division and is on leave after completing 50 combat missions over Europe as pilot of a Liberator bomber, has returned to the University of Idaho campus for a visit.

Democrats Spend \$1,052,589 Between Jan. 1 and Oct. 25

WASHINGTON, Oct. 27—(AP)—The democratic national committee spent \$1,052,589 between Jan. 1 and Oct. 25, out of \$1,093,178 in contributions during the same period, it reported to the clerk of the house of representatives today.

With a bank balance of \$40,588 on Oct. 25, the national committee, in a report submitted by Miss Mae Oliver, assistant treasurer, said it had unpaid obligations of \$131,015.40.

President Roosevelt, candidate for a fourth term, has contributed \$1000 to the committee, the report showed.

Labor Shifting Hits Ship Work

WASHINGTON, Oct. 27—(AP)—The 12 shipyards building top priority assault ships for operations in the Pacific are having difficulty in increasing their working forces as a result of "an extremely high turnover," War Manpower Commissioner Paul V. McNutt said today.

He said the importance of the ships cannot be overemphasized and appealed to workers to "stay on the job."

In September the 12 shipyards hired 23,200 workers but lost 20,700 for a net gain of 2,500.

Although production of assault ships in September nearly doubled the August output, neither month was up to "sharply expanding schedules," McNutt reported.

Doctor Wassell, famous for his evacuation of wounded Americans to the ship and Navy Day speaker here, unexpectedly ran into the Netherlands naval officer who blew up the Java harbor installations.

"This is a remarkable coincidence," exclaimed De Stoppelaar. "You're the only one off that ship I've seen."

Wassell's reply: "You're the second man off that boat that I've seen."

Gas Explosion Kills Driver

THE DALLES, Oct. 27—(AP)—Richard L. Fegam, Portland, was burned to death when his tank

truck of 100-octane gasoline exploded in the southern part of Wasco county, yesterday.

The truck was en route to the Redmond army airbase when the brakes on the truck and attached trailer apparently failed on a grade, it was reported here today. Fegam guided the truck into a bank and managed to get free of the wreckage, but the following explosion caught him in flames thrown a quarter of a mile, state police said.

The highway was blocked more than three hours.
