Menke Offers Scoring Plan

NEW YORK, Nov. 23-(AP)- Frank G. Menke, sports' fact and figures champion, argued today that tie games in football could be avoided if a sliding scale of increased values were placed on points after touchdowns scored from distances greater than those from the two-yard line.

He made the suggestion after studying the scores of a recent season in which he said the number of ties involving college eleveners approached the 150-mark. "No one likes tie-games and I think that my plan would eliminate most of them," he said.

Menke would have the extra points registered from the two-yard line, where the ball is put in play under the present code, retain their one-point value. Those from the 22-yard line would count two points in the Menke plan and those from the 32 would be worth three points.

"Not only would the id help eliminate ties," says Menke, "but I am sure that it would add kicking and passing thrills, especially if a team scored late in the game."

Sears, Lynn Race Winners

SPOKANE, Nov. 23-(AP)- Ray Sears of the San Diego Marine base today clipped 41 seconds off the previous record as he won a service men's cross-country race in 23 minutes 17 seconds during races billed by the sponsoring Spokane Athletic Round Table as the second annual Pacific coast cross-country championships.

In the collegiate race, Defending Champion Bob Lynn of Central Washington College of Education placed first in 21 minutes 26 seconds. Kenneth McPherson of the University of British Columbia placed second as he did last year, and Jack Anderson of the University of Idaho was third. Johnny Fulton, San Francisco Athletic club star, received a leg injury during the race and was forced to withdraw.

The University of Idaho naval trainees won team competition in the service division with 29 points.

Army 11 Tops Passing Clubs

NEW YORK, Nov. 23-(AP)- Much has been written and said concerning Army's running attack which features Glenn Davis, the country's leading scorer; Dale Hall, Max Minor, Dean Sensenbaur and Felix Blanchard, but statistics furnished by the National Collegiate Athletic bureau show Army also has the highest passing average among the 10 teams highest in the Associated Press poll.

The Cadets, with Doug Kenna, Tom Lombardo and Al Tucker doing the flinging, have completed 58 passes out of 110 attempts for an average of 138.5 yards gained a game. Army also leads in interceptions, having grabbed 31 alien aerials.

Southern California is runner-up to the Cadets in completions with 50 out of 100 and Notre Dame ranks next to the Soldiers with an average of 129.2 yards gained through the air in each case.
