Commendation Announced for 2 Salem Men

AAF, PACIFIC OCEAN AREAS, WESTERN PACIFIC (Delayed) - Two men from Salem, Ore., Staff Sgt. Emmet Gilmer and Sgt. Marvin D. Hageman, members of a P-47 fighter squadron, have been commended officially for combat action with their 7th AAF assault unit, which landed on Salpang during the Marianas campaign.

The commendation, from Maj. John J. Hussey, squadron commanding officer, states: "Despite enemy bombing, strafing, shelling and both sniping and infiltration raids by Japanese armed groups, they worked day and night, untiringly and uncompromisingly, to pave the way for the arrival of our P-47 Thunderbolt fighter planes and to insure efficient operation during the days of combat to follow."

Sergeant Gilmer's home is at 2463 Center, Salem. He is a crew chief with the 7th AAF. A brother, Staff Sgt. Earl A., is with an artillery unit in India.

Lieutenant Lindstrom Prisoner of Germans

First Lt. Robert D. Lindstrom, son of Mr. and Mrs. T. A. Lindstrom, 2605 Cherry Ave., Salem, has been reported as a prisoner of war in Germany, according to the International Red Cross and U. S. government. A pilot of a B-17 bomber, Lieutenant Lindstrom was at first reported missing in action February 25, 1944.

Lt. W.C. Dyer Is Wounded

Mrs. William C. Dyer received a letter from her husband, Lt. Dyer, Monday stating that he had been wounded in Germany and is now hospitalized in Belgium. The letter was written on Thanksgiving day. He was struck in the back by shrapnel, but hopes to soon return to his outfit as he is the only officer left in his company that the men know. The other officers have been killed or wounded seriously.

Lt. Dyer has been awarded the combat infantryman's badge for exemplary conduct and troop leadership while in combat and under fire.

The Salem officer trained at Camp Adair with the Timberwolf division, leaving for overseas late in the summer. His wife and nine month old son, William Connell, III, reside at 270 North 13th street.

William Duncan Convalescing in Britain Hospital

A US GENERAL HOSPITAL IN ENGLAND - (Special) - Pfc. William J. Duncan, 26 of 642 Edgewater street, Salem, Ore., is convalescing at this United States army general hospital in England after being wounded by an enemy bullet in Belgium.

"Pfc. Duncan is recovering rapidly and will soon begin our rehabilitation program," said his war surgeon, Capt. Arthur R. Borckeh of Weehawken, N.J.

After capturing 17 Germans single-handed near Soissons, Pfc. Duncan was driving his jeep over a hill overlooking a potential bridge-site at the Meuse river, when he was hit by an enemy bullet from the opposite bank.

"My legs were numbed," the Oregon soldier said, "so I pushed the starter down with my hand and drove the jeep to an aid station." His wound was dressed and he was flown to England by C-47. Pfc. Duncan entered the army in November, 1941. His parents are Mr. and Mrs. William H. Duncan of Salem.

GERVAIS - Mr. and Mrs. Herman Jelderks recently received a letter from their son, Earl, stating that he is in Italy, has seen Rome, and has climbed one of the principal mountains. He said he was well but indicated he had incurred minor wounds. He operates a moving picture machine at one of the camps.

Stock Market Records Many 7-Year Highs

NEW YORK, Dec. 4 - (AP) - Led by rails, steels and selected industrials, the stock market registered many 7-year highs today with gains of fractions to more than 2 points on one of the largest turnovers in the past six months.

The apparent slowing down of the European conflict accentuated Prime Minister Churchill's warning of a possible longer war and revived demand for armament-connected securities because of lessening apprehension over re-conversion problems. Expectation of more pleasing year-end dividends also was helpful. Assorted leaders failed to make headway, however, as Wall Street skepticism still was in evidence and December tax adjustments served as a handicap.

Rising prices ruled at the start in broad and lively dealings. Top marks were trimmed here and there at the close but plus marks were well in the majority.

The Associated Press 60-stock average was up .3 of a point at 56.1 where it was only .3 under the highest level since 1937 established in July. The rail composite advanced .7 to 31.2, a peak since December, 1937. Of 946 issues appearing, 580 were up, 168 down and 198 unchanged. Transfers of 1,427,780 shares compared with 924,880 Friday and were the third largest since July 17.

Propping sentiment to some extent was the sale of a stock exchange membership for \$65,000, up \$5000 from the last previous transaction.

Prizes Offered In Retail Store Bond Contests

One hundred and 10 prizes will be awarded to Oregon retailers in the Sixth War Loan national display contest, to compete with California and Washington winners for sectional prizes, and later for national awards.

John M. Lansinger, secretary of the Oregon Food Merchants association and Oregon chairman for this contest, has urged that retailers secure material and rules of the contest from their local war finance retail committees.

There will be ten state prizes for each of eleven classes of stores: department, drug, gasoline stations and garages, food, hardware, jewelry, men's apparel, radio, women's apparel and specialty, furniture and floor covering, limited price variety stores.
