TUNA FISH AND NOODLE CASSEROLE

1 can tuna fish, flaked 2 cups noodles, cooked 2 tablespoons butter 2 tablespoons flour 1 cup milk 2 tablespoons parsley, chopped Salt and pepper 1/2 cup bread crumbs Place layer of tuna fish in casserole and cover with layer of noodles. Repeat until fish and noodles are used up. Melt butter in saucepan. Take off heat and mix with flour making a smooth paste. Return to heat and add milk stirring constantly. When mixture has thickened add parsley and salt and pepper to taste. Pour sauce over fish and noodles and top with bread crumbs. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 minutes.
