Byron Randall, former Salem man whose paintings have attracted national attention in the past few years, has been given added honors in Los Angeles. A second exhibition of his paintings has been placed in the Little Gallery at Beverly Hills and has received glowing praise by Los Angeles reviewers.

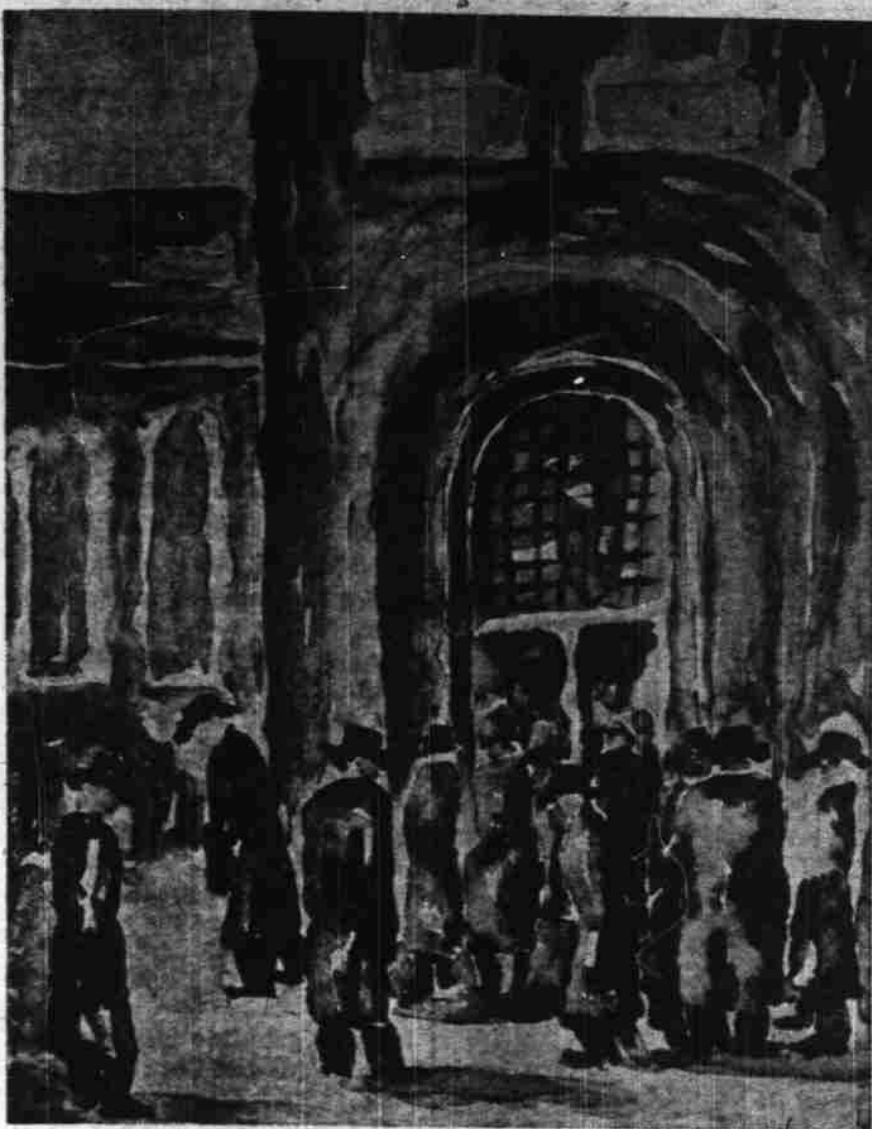

Ike Tells German Workers They Can Form Trade Unions

LONDON, Dec. 16 (AP)—General Eisenhower told German workers today they would be permitted to form democratic trade unions under allied military government but served notice that

"strikes threatening military security, directly or indirectly, will be prohibited."

"So will lock-outs," the supreme commander's spokesman said, in the twelfth of a series of broadcasts to the German people. The Nazi controlled labor front will be abolished at once, Eisenhower said, and all deductions of pay or collections from workers for its support will cease.

Senate Adds \$160,000 To Albany Lab. Funds

WASHINGTON, DC, Dec. 16 (AP)—The senate yesterday added \$160,000 to the deficiency appropriation bill, for operating expenses of the new Northwest hydro-electric development laboratory at Albany, Ore.
