INGLEWOOD, Calif., Dec. 16-(P)-Happy Issue, game, stretch-running filly, owned and trained by C. H. (French) Pinon, who picked her up in a \$1,500 claiming race, today won the fifth running of the \$75,000 Hollywood gold cup in the track record time of 2:01.3 for a mile and one-quarter. Bull Reigh was second and Okana third. Paperboy, backed down to 9-5 as the choice of the crowd of 6,000, was fourth, unable to match the sizzling pace that Happy Issue cut out after jockey Hedley Woodhouse applied the whip.

Parole Board Would Assume New Powers

The authority imposed in the governor to issue pardons to persons serving terms in the state penitentiary and county jails and to grant commutations of sentence would be transferred to the state parole board under a bill now being prepared for introduction at the 1945 legislative session.

Sponsors said such a law would relieve the governor of considerable work and give him more time to attend to his executive duties.

The parole board, under the proposed new law, would hold one meeting annually in each of the four congressional districts to hear pardon applications. Special meetings would be called in cases of emergency. Members of the board, when outside of Salem on either intercollegiate outfit tonight, Willamette hosts the Gobs in a return match at Salem next Friday night, December 22.

Another legislative bill, under preparation here, provides for a gross income tax which sponsors said would produce approximately \$1,000,000 a month. Revenues from the tax would be used largely for old age assistance. An accompanying bill would place the minimum old age assistance payments at \$40 a month with no ceiling.

Attorney General George Neuner reported Saturday that he has received a large number of requests to assist in the preparation of legislative bills. Most of these came from the Multnomah county delegation.

The 1945 legislature opens here January 8.
