"Unless the ways and means committee can obtain additional revenues or use some of the funds it is apparent that many proposed appropriations outside the budget Henry Semon, chairman of the house ways and means committee, declared Monday.

Regarding the suggestion that some of the money proposed for capital outlays be used for other purposes, Semon said that even though all of the capital outlay appropriations recommended in the budget are approved only a small part of the total could be used until the close of the war.

It was pointed out that several large appropriations for capital outlays at the 1943 legislative session have not been used due to the inability of the state to obtain priorities and because of the manpower shortage.

The general fund capital outlay appropriation recommendations of Gov. Earl Snell and the state budget division for the next biennium aggregate close to \$4,000,000.


