Ranch Ramblings

Methods of farm accounting will be discussed Tuesday at 10 a.m. at the chamber of commerce rooms in the city hall at Dallas.

Prof. G. W. Kuhlman of the farm management department, Oregon State college, will be on hand to answer questions. The morning session will be devoted principally to assisting farmers in starting new account records.

Slugs are appearing in fields in Yamhill county, Rex Warren, county agent, reports. Warren suggests getting at them at once with bait made up of 1½ pounds

metalddehyde, 8 pounds calcium arsenate to 100 pounds of bran. The bait should be applied at the rate of four to five pounds an acre. Tests should be made before applying any quantity of bait. Place small piles at approximately 10-foot intervals and check in 24 hours. If six or more slugs are found at each pile, then bait is recommended. The bait can be purchased already mixed at seed and feed stores, Warren says.

In the circuit court room of the Dallas courthouse, February 1, at 10 a.m., W. C. Leth, Polk county agent, will conduct a meeting for fruit and nut growers. C. E. Schuster, Prof. Henry Hartman and R. E. Rieder will be present to discuss spraying, management and soil problems.

Owing to an expected reduction in the volume of farm products for sale in 1945 and a probable increase in some farm costs, the U. S. net farm income in 1945 is expected to be less than in 1944 and 1943. Data of the Oregon agricultural experiment station and U. S. department of agriculture indicates that net farm income rarely reaches one-half of the gross farm receipts, except in war time.

Leghorns account for 46 per cent of the total of all breeds of chickens raised in Oregon. New Hampshires run second with 34 per cent. In the United States, Leghorns also lead with 33.8 per cent, but Plymouth Rocks come second with 25.6 per cent and New Hampshires register but 10 per cent over the country as a whole.

SCALLOPED OYSTERS

2 dozen large oysters
5 cups coarsely crumbled crackers
¼ teaspoon salt
¼ teaspoon pepper
1 cup oyster liquor and milk
1 teaspoon grated onion
¼ cup butter or substitute

Drain oysters, reserving liquid, add top milk to make one cup. Arrange one third of crumbs in greased 2-quart casserole, place half oysters on top, sprinkle with salt and pepper, repeat and top with remaining crumbs. Heat liquor and milk, onion and butter until latter is melted. Pour over oyster mixture and bake in moderate oven at 350 degrees for 35 minutes. This serves 6.

SEA FOOD RAREBIT

1½ cups water
¼ teaspoon salt
½ lb. shrimp or crab meat
1 dozen oysters
3 tablespoons fat
4 tablespoons flour
¾ cup grated cheese
Salt and pepper
24 crackers

Drain oysters, reserving liquid. Melt fat in saucepan. Stir in flour. Gradually add fish liquor with enough milk to make 3 cups. Cook until thick and smooth. Add cheese and stir until melted. Season. Add fish, heat thoroughly and serve on crackers. Serves 6 or more.

KALE SUPREME

3 tablespoons fat
2 tablespoons chopped onion
1 cup chopped cooked meat
¼ cup flour
2 cups milk
4 cups chopped cooked kale
Salt and pepper to taste
1 cup coarse cracker crumbs

Saute onion and meat in fat. Stir in flour. Add milk and cook until thickened. Add kale and seasonings and pour into 1½ quart casserole. Top with cracker crumbs and cheese. Bake in moderate oven (350 degrees F.) 30 minutes. Serves 6.
