# Parents Give Up Hope for Elmer Smelser

AUMSVILLE-Hope that their son, Pfc. Elmer E. Smelser, US marine corps, might possibly be alive in some hospital, was abandoned this week by Mr. and Mrs. Guy Smelser when two men who had been with their son in the south Pacific came to visit them; and told them of his death on Sai-

The to marine corps men were Col. Stuart Sprague and Cpl. Edwin Mendenhall, from the marine barracks at Klamath Falls. They are veterans of Guadalcanal and Gilbert islands, Tarawa and Sai-

Elmer Smelser was born at New Grand Ronde October 28, 1921, and lived near Willamina until 14 years old. He moved with his parents to the farm near Stayton and then attended Stayton high school. He was baptized in the Church of Christ March 26, 1939, and attended Bethel Sunday school in Stayton and was graduated from Stayton high school in June, 1941. He was an Eagle Scout and was assistant scoutmaster when he enlisted in the marine corps in May, 1942. He took boot training at San Diego and went overseas in the following October. After Guadalcanal he was returned to New Zealand to recover from malaria and wounds.

He was fatally wounded June 28, 1944, while on a volunteer mission to locate a Japanese machine gun nest. He lived an hour. He was buried in the Second marine cemetery on Saipan. His parents were notified of his death by the navy department on August 2,
