

## 24 Children Being Tutored

Twenty-four children and young persons unable to attend regular public school classes because of poor health or physical disabilities are being tutored at home by qualified teachers provided by the Salem school district, W. E. Snyder, curriculum director for Salem schools, said Saturday. All grade levels are represented, and the range of subjects includes the usual courses of the school program.

The number of such pupils this year is almost double that of last year, the first during which the program was in operation here. Rheumatic fever patients, those with low vitality, poliomyelitis, serious injuries of various types and chronic illnesses are eligible for the special service.

Funds for carrying the school into the homes of such pupils are supplied by the state under provisions of a bill passed at the 1943 session of the state legislature.

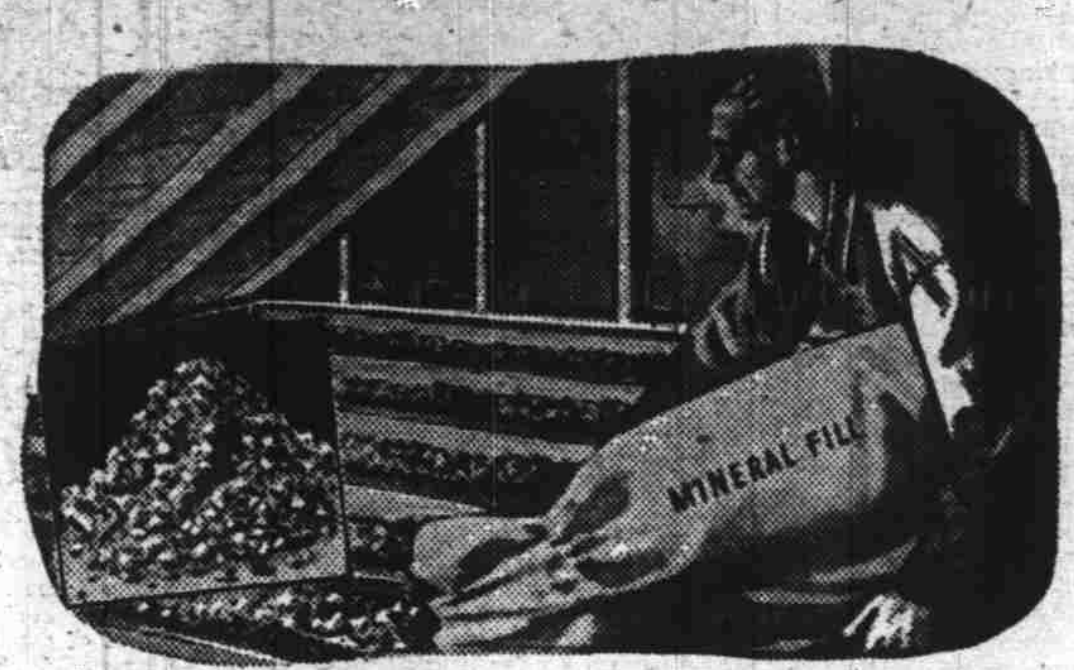

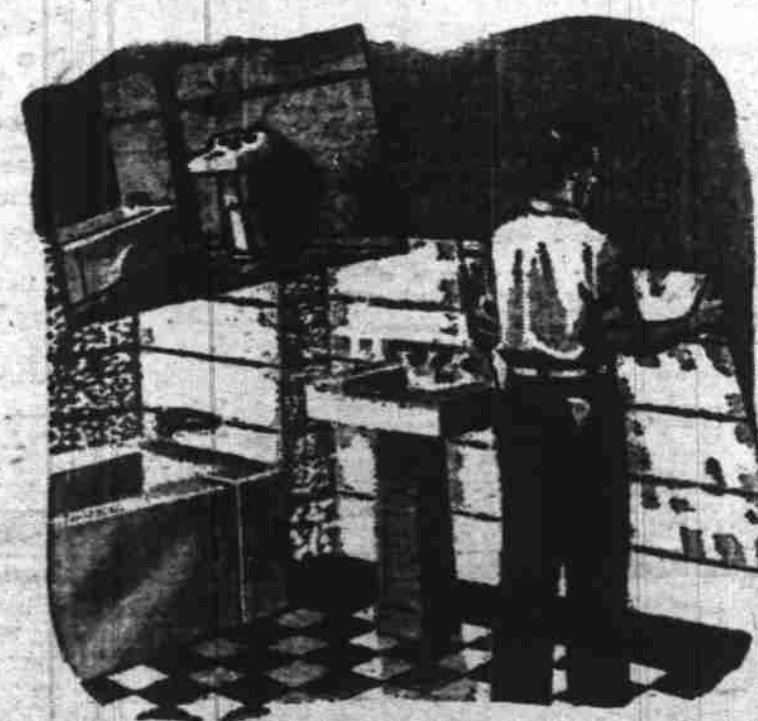
