Mrs. Gerald Pittam is spending a few days at the Snyder home.

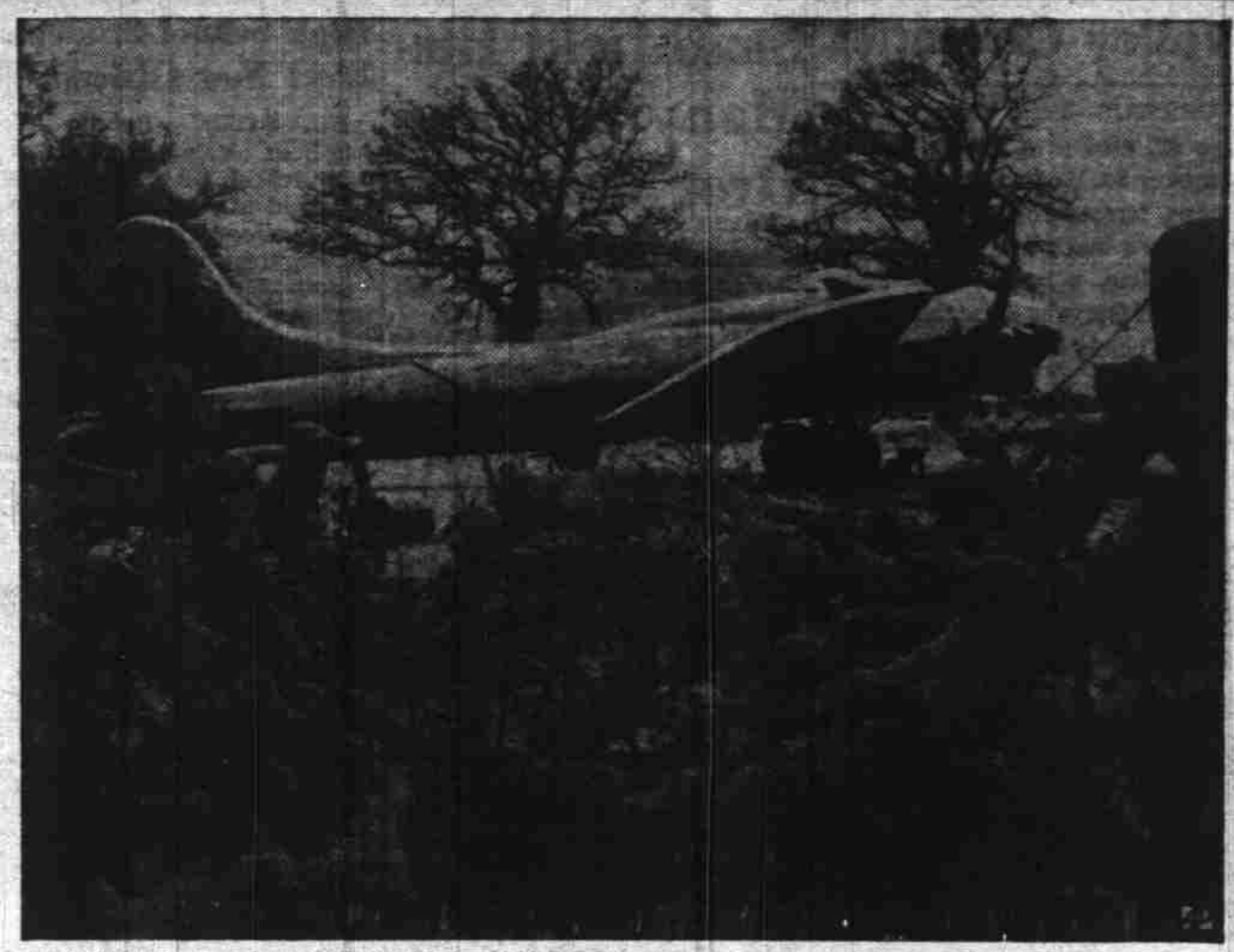
Mr. and Mrs. A. Snyder are in Portland with their son Arnold who is expecting to enter the service in the near future.

Polk county persons wishing to have soil tests made may bring them to Yokum's store, Perrydale, on February 6 when O. V. Chenoweth will be there to discuss fertilizers and soil management. Chenoweth is assistant extension specialist from Corvallis.

The meeting has been called for 2 p. m. by Ted Tibbutt, assistant Polk county agent.

Chris Fischer in the Beaver creek area, reports that he drilled subterranean seed into an old planting of orchard grass with clover rows about three feet apart. This was a few years ago. Now, says Fischer, although heavy pasturing has been the practice, the clover gives complete coverage and a very fine pasture on what used to be a poor field. The subterranean clover was seeded in May.

The Oswego lime plant has increased its capacity from 75 tons to 200 tons a day. At the present time deliveries are made to anyone doing his own trucking. This situation is not expected to last very long and purchasers are being advised to arrange ahead when doing their own trucking.

Otto Wellman, owner of the Butte Creek orchard north of Monitor will be assisted by Arthur King, Oregon State college specialist, in laying out a plan for gravity irrigation of his property on February 23.
