Coast Guard Eases Rules For Recruits

Liberalization for an indefinite period of physical requirements for 17-year-old recruits in the US coastguard is reported by Chief Yeoman O. L. Puckett, in charge of the coastguard recruiting office for Oregon at 806 Southwest Morrison, Portland 5.

Minimum visual requirements now are 20-50 in one eye and 20-40 in the other, corrected by glasses to 29-30 in both. Weight may now be 10 per cent under previous minimum standards, and the minimum height has been reduced to 5 feet, 2 inches. Dental requirements also have been modified.

Puckett also reports that the coastguard will hold a competitive examination for appointment of cadets to the coastguard academy, May 9 and 10. This is open to physically qualified young men, either military or civilian, between the ages of 17 and 22 years. Educational requirements are, in general, those necessary for admission to engineering colleges, and graduates of the four-year course are commissioned ensigns in the regular coastguard.


