

EGGS FLORENTINE 3 cups cooked spinach

Spinach should be drained well after heating, then cut very fine. Turn hot spinach into a shallow baking dish. Make six depressions, pressing spinach well up on the sides so that a raw egg may be dropped into each. Sprinkle eggs with salt. Prepare a cheese sauce by melting the cheese in the milk over boiling water. Heat until cheese is just melted. Pour hot cheese sauce over eggs and spinach. Top with buttred crumbs and bake in a moderate oven (375 degrees) until crumbs are brown, about 25 minutes. Yield: 6 servings.
