

List of Hero-Dead Now Totals Nearly 290; Aid of All Needed In Making Plaques Accurate

The hero-dead of World war II now totals nearly 290 from Marion county and the immediately surrounding area, a compilation of The Oregon Statesman's records showed today.

The Marion county list totals 199, the other 90 being from Polk, Yamhill, Benton, Linn and Clackamas county sectors, averaging within a radius of 25 to 35 miles of Salem.

The complete list is published herein in an effort to aid organizations preparing plaques in various communities. It includes at least three from the merchant marine and one from the Norwegian air force.

In many instances, it has been impossible to determine the specific branch of service, the specific address (many living on rural routes which might extend into two counties gave other than their immediate smaller communities as their home towns in their service records), the exact area in which they died (official announcements in many instances specify only "theaters"), and the present home addresses of their families.

Since there is no official source for such a list, and since there are multitudinous chances of error because of family removals and the many sources from which the unofficial list has been drawn, The Statesman is requesting written notification of omissions or errors of any kind. In this way it is hoped to be of help in enabling memorials to be as accurate as humanly possible in honoring those who were residents of the mid-Willamette valley.

Flag-Raising Photo Will Be Loan Symbol

WASHINGTON, March 24—(AP)—The famous Associated Press photo of marines raising the flag on Mount Suribachi has been chosen as the official symbol of the Seventh War Loan.



Treasury officials said today they will display it more widely than any other picture has been displayed in history.

Ted R. Gamble, director of the war finance division, said: "I expect it to be the greatest poster of the war."

Tom Lane, director of advertising, press and radio for the war finance division, said it will be presented in various forms constantly before the "eyes of millions of Americans in every community."

He said the treasury had received hundreds of letters suggesting that the picture be used to sell war bonds.

Joe Rosenthal, Associated Press photographer, snapped the photo on the island of Iwo Jima as he followed a heroic band of marines up the slopes of Mount Suribachi while the battle raged.

C. C. Beall, noted artist, has redone the picture in an oil painting so that it will appear in color. He said he didn't change a line of the photo.
