A.C. Marsters, Fair Official, Leader, Dies

ROSEBURG, March 29-(AP)—Alva C. Marsters, founder of the National Bank here in 1907 and chairman of the state fair board for 15 years, died at his home last night after a long illness.
Marsters was president of the Roseburg National bank for 30 years, retiring in 1937 when it was sold. He was the first mayor elected after the city's incorporation and served as state senator from Douglas county from 1900-1904.

His father established Marsters Drug company at Roseburg, the city's oldest retail business firm. The family came to Oregon in 1875.
His tenure on the state fair board continued under gubernatorial appointment until it was transferred to the department of agriculture.
A son, Lyle E., Roseburg, and a grandson survive.

If You Wear False Teeth, Take Notice

CHICAGO, March 29-(AP)—If you travel by airplane at the higher altitudes, hang onto your false teeth!

Otherwise you're liable to lose 'em, says an article in the April Journal of the American Dental Association.
The reason is that reduced atmospheric pressure at increased altitudes makes it more difficult to keep dentures in place. Four naval officers at the Jacksonville, Fla., naval air station, reporting on experiments they conducted in a pressure chamber, said:
"In practically all instances much less force was required to dislodge the dentures at 30,000 feet than at sea level."
Their experiments, incidentally, were with upper dentures but they said it appeared logical to assume atmospheric pressure would have a proportionate effect on retention of lower plates.

Morse Raps Government For Strikes

NEW YORK, March 29-(AP)—Sen. Wayne Morse (R-Ore.) said tonight the federal government "must take its share of responsibility for war time strikes."

Morse, a former war labor board member, speaking on "America's town meeting" program broadcast over the Blue network, said he thought "the government broke faith with labor and management and with the WLB when it did not leave the board free to settle labor disputes as a supreme court of labor during the war."
Superimposing the office of the director of economic stabilization and the office of war mobilization on top of the WLB "without clearly defined jurisdiction, policies and powers caused much confusion and resulted in the development of procedures which caused untold delays," he said.

Cebu Yankees Invade Nearby Mactan Island

MANILA, Friday, March 30-(AP)—Elements of Maj. Gen. William H. Arnold's American division, conquerors of Cebu city on Cebu, invaded Mactan island, directly across a narrow channel from that second port of the Philippines on Wednesday, Gen.

day.
The tiny island of Cault, to the southwest in Cebu harbor, also was invaded. Cault is a seaplane base.
MacArthur said Opon, the main city of Mactan, was secured. On Mactan island is the biggest coconut oil refinery in the Philippines, set ablaze by Japanese demolition crews Monday when the Yanks landed on Cebu.
On Cebu itself, the infantrymen struck north and south from the demolition-wrecked capital city, capturing Lahug airfield to the north and the town of Naga, 14 miles south.
