Freed Prisoners Will Make Big Change in Europe, Lions Told

Millions of freed prisoners in Europe, all of whom hate the Nazi ideology, will bring about a greater change than many persons anticipate, Hans Hofstetter, who was with the World War I army of occupation after the fall of Germany, told the Hollywood Lions club Wednesday.

Hofstetter said mass surrender

was all but impossible as a result of life-long regimentation and penalties; declared Hitler's rise to power was made possible by the guild system, the caste of apprentices and low standards of living, and said that promises of power, wealth and the natural cruelty of some Germans led to the persecutions of the Jews.

OMAHA—(AP)—Passengers gasped, smiled and applauded when E. E. Harrington, Omaha bus driver, stopped his vehicle in mid-run, turned toward them and made a political speech.

Harrington, who is campaigning for Omaha city commissioner, said "It's pretty unusual to find a man who can work and carry on a political campaign at the same time." He promises, if elected, to make "as good a commissioner as I have been a motorman."

MEATS, FATS, ETC.:
Book 4—Red stamps T1 through X2 good through July 31. Stamps T3 through X5 good through April 30; Y5 and Z5 through D2 good through June 2; E2 through J2 good through June 30; K2 through F2 good through July 31.

PROCESSED FOODS:
Book 4—Blue stamps X3 through Z5 and A2 and B2 good through March 31. Stamps C2 through G2 good through April 30; H2 through L2 good through June 30.

SUGAR:
Book 4—Stamp 35 valid for five pounds through June 2. Next stamp scheduled to be validated May 1.

SHOES:
Book 3—Airplane stamps 1, 2 and 3 valid indefinitely.

GASOLINE:
A 15 coupons good everywhere for four gallons each through June 21.

FUEL OIL:
Period 1-5 (incl) coupons valid through August 31. Not more than 16 per cent of season's rations should have been used to date.
