### Linda Bennett Has Birthday

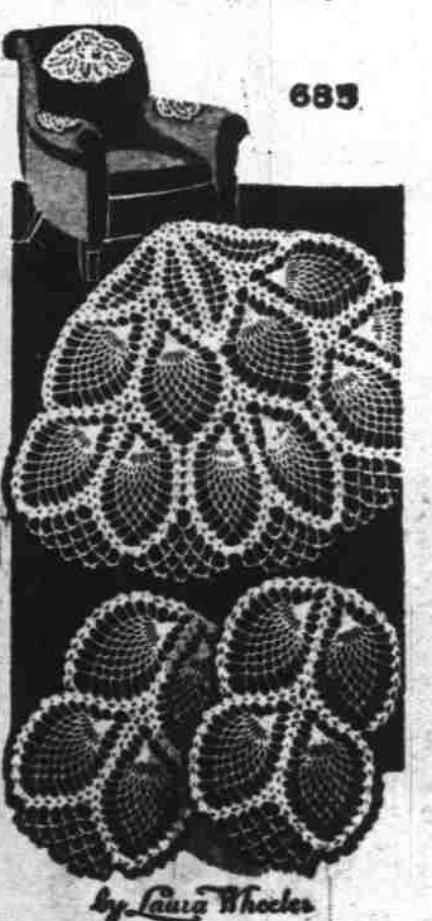

### CODFISH CAKES WITH HORSE RADISH

1 cup shredded codfish  
2 cups mashed potatoes  
1 egg  
1/4 teaspoon pepper  
2 tablespoons fat  
Freshen codfish by soaking in cold water for 30 minutes. Squeeze dry. Combine mashed potatoes, codfish and beaten egg and mix thoroughly. Form into four cakes. Sauté cakes in fat in hot skillet until brown on both sides. Serve with:

### HORSE RADISH SAUCE

4 tablespoons grated horseradish  
2 tablespoons vinegar  
1/4 teaspoon salt  
Few grains cayenne  
1/2 cup evaporated milk  
Use fresh horseradish if it is obtainable, otherwise the bottled kind will do. Mix it with salt, vinegar and cayenne and stir in evaporated milk beaten stiff.

SUGAR: Book 4—Stamp 28 valid for five pounds through June 1. Stamp 28 now valid.

SHOES: Book 2—Airplane stamps 1, 2 and 3 valid indefinitely.

GASOLINE: A 15 coupons good everywhere for four gallons each through June 2.

FUEL OIL: Period 1-8 (total) coupons valid through August 2. Not more than 10 per cent of season's ration should have been used to date.

### Manufacture's Casserole Recipe

A can of cream of mushroom soup and a dash of corn flakes make a handy shortcut to casserole dishes, according to the makers of Albers cornflakes.

Low in sugar content but high in popularity is this dessert for springtime.

### GLAZED RHUBARB TURN-ABOUT

Glazed Rhubarb  
1 pound rhubarb, cut in 1-inch pieces (about 4 cups)  
1/2 cup sugar  
2 tablespoons enriched flour  
1/4 cup corn syrup  
Place rhubarb in four individual casseroles. Mix sugar and flour. Add syrup and mix well. Pour over rhubarb.

Score Turn-About  
1 1/2 cups sifted enriched flour  
1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
2 tablespoons shortening  
1/4 cup milk  
1 tablespoon corn syrup  
1/2 teaspoon lemon extract  
1 egg, beaten  
Sift together flour, baking powder and salt. Cut or rub in shortening. Add milk, syrup and lemon extract to egg. Add all to flour mixture, stirring only enough to moisten flour. Drop dough by teaspoonfuls on rhubarb mixture, forming rings around edge of dish. Bake in moderately hot oven (400 degrees Fahrenheit) about 20 minutes. Yield: four glazed rhubarb turn-abouts.
