### Monmouth Teacher Purchases Property

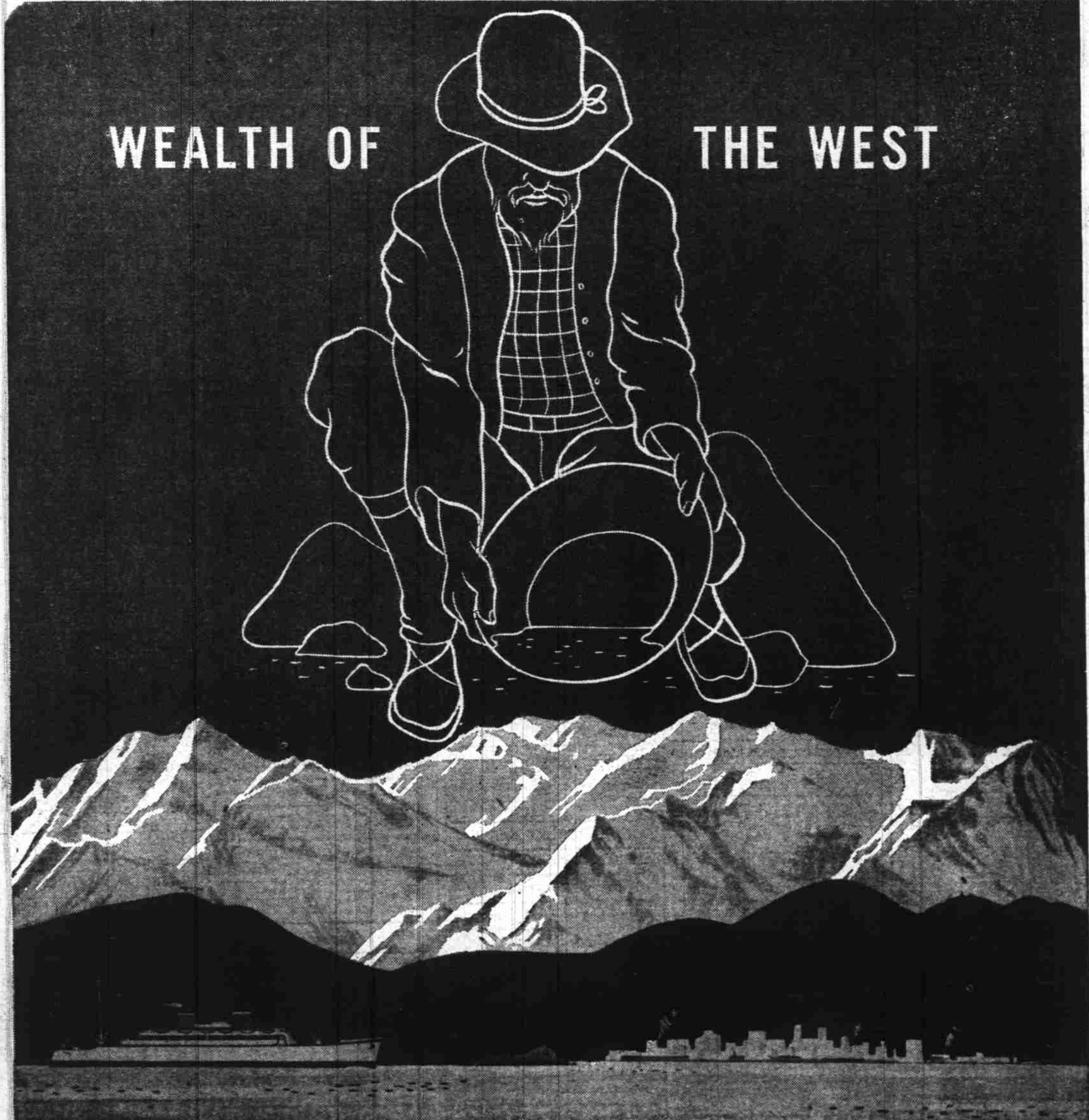
