IN THE

SIXTH ARMY GROUP, Germany-The city of Wurzburg, in southwestern Germany, lay in ruins after receiving terrible pastings from the air. The rubblestrewn streets and gutted buildings were deceivingly quiet. But hidden in doorways and behind walls, the enemy was waiting with machine guns trained on advancing American doughboys.

On the outskirts of the city, Combat Command "A" of the 12th Armored "Hellcat" division stood poinsed, ready to act as trouble shooters in case the Krauts proved difficult. A short time later, the quiet was shattered as the wellentrenched Germans poured round after round of fire into the American infantry.


