

Buying Sends Stock Average Up .2 Point

NEW YORK, June 12.—(AP)—Buying of assorted aircraft, rails and utilities put props under today's stock market although many leaders continued to stumble.

Special situations and a mild revival of peace-time optimism inspired much of the bidding. Transfers totaled 1,320,000 shares compared with 1,490,000 Monday.

The Associated Press 60-stock average was up .2 of a point at 65.9. Of 922 issues appearing 413 were up against 317 declines.

Aviations were spurred by the belief heavy fighting plane demand would keep manufacturers busy for some time to come.

At peaks for 1945 or longer were Grumman, Boeing, American Airlines, Electric Power & Light, United Corp., Standard Gas Preferred and M-K-T Preferred.

Grain Futures Close Mixed

CHICAGO, June 12.—(AP)—Grain futures were mixed at the close today. Wheat started on the easy side and July was off as much as 3/4 cent before commission house buying developed local support of enough volume to make the finishes fractionally on either side of yesterday's close.

The bearish influence of the federal crop estimate, released yesterday, started a downward trend at the opening, but when support developed, traders gave consideration to the senate's favorable action on price control and the still untangled boxcar situation.

At the close wheat was 1/4 higher to 1/2 lower than yesterday's close, July 1.67 1/2-3/4. Corn was 1/4 lower to 1/2 higher, July 1.18 1/2-3/4. Oats were 1/4 higher, July 65 1/2-3/4. Rye was 1/4 higher, July 1.43 1/2-3/4. Barley was unchanged to 1/4 lower, July 1.12 1/2-3/4.

It's Colder

It's a lot colder in the Co-op Market now than when it began operating last year. There are three machines making things cold in the Market. One keeps milk, butter, cheese, yeast, lunchmeat, etc. cold. Another one keeps frozen fruits and vegetables frozen for you until you take them home. The last one installed is a big cooler (10x10) to keep vegetables, fruit and flowers constantly fresh. More loans are needed to help pay for this one. Market is still on a cash basis. All equipment is paid for. So is all the stock on hand. Let us have a few more loans. Directors recommend that you lend not less than \$25. No one is permitted to loan the Co-op more than \$200. Everybody that wants to shall have the privilege of getting 4% interest. That is the rate of interest paid on loans to the Co-op.

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ODT Adds to Deliveries of Fresh Fruits

PORTLAND — (Special) — The office of defense transportation has taken steps to permit additional wholesale deliveries of fresh fruits and vegetables to be speeded during the summer, and to avoid spoilage of perishables.

Donald F. Call, ODT district manager in Portland, said that under a new general permit, ODT 17-31, issued in Washington, wholesale dealers of fresh fruits and vegetables may make one "less than full truck load" delivery a day to each store on a route for six days a week during June, July, August and September. Formerly wholesalers were allowed to make one such delivery five days a week.

There is no limitation on the number of "full truck loads."
