

# SP Observes Third Annual 'Service Day'

Coinciding with Flag day and the Seventh War Loan, the third annual "Southern Pacific War Service Day" will be observed here today and throughout the railroad's widespread system.

The 96,000 Southern Pacific railroaders on their vital home-front jobs will wear miniature service flags honoring the more than 19,000 fellow workers who joined the armed services, including approximately 200 already known to have given their lives. At employees rallies that will not interfere with trains or service they will pledge more war bond purchases, more blood donations, and will dedicate themselves to their war job as key-noted recently by President A. T. Merber when he said:

"With the war turned in full force on the Japanese, you who have performed so well in wartime transportation and west coast transportation service will be given even greater tasks. I know you will not flinch. "Railroad transportation will be lighter immediately ahead. I am confident we shall have public understanding as we tackle the decisive transportation job of the war. Let us give our utmost to bring final victory quickly to save the lives of our boys in the Pacific."

## Late Buying Helps Stocks In Recovery

NEW YORK, June 13-(AP)—Late buying changed mixed tendencies of today's stock market into a general recovery paced by gains of more than 3 points in aircrafts and fair-sized advances in utilities, specialties and steels.

Aviations received the most attention throughout the session and several touched new 1945 highs as investors figured business would be brisk for planes in the Pacific war theatre and also in the post-war period.

The list was liberally sprinkled with other yearly peaks, including Public Service of New Jersey, United Corp., Missouri-Kansas-Texas preferred and Colorado Fuel & Iron. Transactions totaled 1,590,000 shares against 1,320,000 Tuesday. The Associated Press 60-share composite rose 2 of a point to 66.1.
