PORTLAND, July 13 (AP)—This area's mosquito plague, which has kept Portlanders in torment for weeks, is at last on the downward grade, E. G. Gavin, supervisor of insect control, reported today.

A crew of diesel-sprayers who cover Multnomah county once a week is finding it much easier to control the culex variety of mosquito, which breeds in pools and drainage ditches, Gavin said. The spraying will be continued through August, he reported.
Flood-water mosquitoes, unusually prevalent in this region, are fast dying off, Gavin said.
