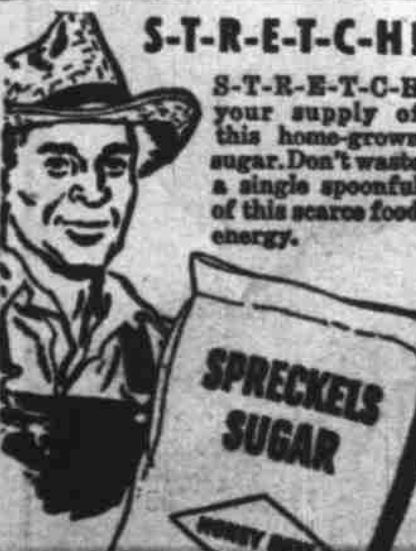

Peel tomatoes and hollow out centers. Invert and allow to drain in the refrigerator. Peel and dice cucumber; combine with tomato pulp, parsley and sour cream and season with salt and pepper to taste. Fill tomato shells with cucumber mixture and serve on a bed of lettuce.
