NEW YORK, Aug. 23 (AP)—The stock market today enjoyed one of its best rallies of the past several years as hopes for nearby postwar business prosperity inspired buying of durable goods issues and a wide assortment of rails.

Gains ranged from one to five points for motors and other favorites. Prices were trimmed here and there at the close but final plus marks running to better than four points predominated. Transfers totaled 1,190,000 shares compared with 760,000 in the preceding session.

Scarce Goods Remain Under Price Control

"All scarce commodities remain under strict price control. These include virtually every item figuring in the cost of living."

This was the advice given the public and business today by acting district OPA director Frederic F. Janney in answer to numerous price control inquiries.

"Only a few items have been exempted, such as high-priced fur coats, low-priced toys and a few other minor items," Janney declared. "Still under control, for instance, are clothing, food, groceries, restaurant prices, consumer services such as laundry and cleaning, together with rentals in all federal rent control areas."

Janney emphasized that removal of price ceilings will come only when supply agencies "tell the OPA there is enough to go around."

Recovery Still Noted in Grain

CHICAGO, Aug. 23 (AP)—A recovery movement in grain futures went through its third straight day today, although some of the gains were shaded fractionally near the close. Rye and barley led with gains of more than 2 cents and 3 cents a bushel, respectively, at times.

Continued reports of export demand and poor European crops, and a strong New York stock market were bolstering influences.

Barley advanced sharply on the announcement that Canada had banned additional exports of that cereal.

Wheat closed 1/4 lower to 1/2 higher than the previous finish, September \$1.64 1/4, corn was unchanged to 1/4 off, December \$1.14 1/4, oats were unchanged to 1/4 lower, September 57 1/2, rye was 1/4 off to 1/4 cents up, September \$1.37 1/2-1/4, and barley was 1/4 to 3/4 cents higher, September \$1.00 1/2.
