USSR Claims To Kuriles

WASHINGTON, Sept 4 -(P)-Secretary of State Byrnes indicated today that the United States would support Russia's claim to certain islands north of Japan and discloses that the Big Three had discussed the subject at Yalta.

The United States is not opposed to the position of Russia on

the Kurile islands and the south-ern half of Sakhalin island, Byrnes told his news conference.

When asked if Premier Stalin had mentioned at Yalta that the islands formerly belonged to Russia, Byrnes said he did not want to discuss that

In a V-J day broadcast, Stalin told the Russian people Sunday that the Soviet Union would regain southern Sakhalin and the Kurile islands, which went to Ja-pan in the war of 1904.

Needing just one point for victory as play opened today, the Russians picked up 51/2 winning four matches and tying three.


Brownlee Resigns As OPA Executive


