

Market Prices Soar to New Session Levels

NEW YORK, Sept. 12 (AP)—Stock market prices advanced fractions to around 3 points and closed near the best levels of today's session with new 1945 highs sprinkled liberally throughout the list.

The rail group and a handful of utilities proved exceptions in the upturn but even their extreme losses were reduced or erased in a number of cases.

Steels, motors, rubbers, retail stores, farm implements, aircraft, metals and chemicals added sizable gains.

Buying orders predominated because of an improved tax outlook due to a house committee's promise to enact measures to reduce 1946 payments. Investment of idle funds and switching from war to peace-rated stocks also stimulated demand.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite reached 69.4—new high since April 22, 1937, and compared with 69.0 yesterday. Industrials hit 93.4, new peak since Aug. 26, 1937, and utilities touched 47.8—a summit since March 2, 1937.

Adjustments in Wages Approved By Regional WLB

Wage adjustments recommended by the 12th regional war production board in two mid-Willamette valley canneries have been approved by William D. Davis, director of economic stabilization, Dr. George Bernard Noble, regional chairman, announced Wednesday.

The settlements there involve California Packing corporation's Salem plant and the Birdseye-Snyder division of General Foods at Woodburn.

Approval by the director of economic stabilization was required

before the adjustments, ordered last June, could become effective because of the employers' statements that price increases would be necessary if such adjustments were granted.

In its original directive orders, the regional board denied all requests for general increases but granted other wage adjustments, including vacations with pay, night work premiums, overtime, seventh day premiums, adjustments in minors' wages and base wages and guarantees for piece workers.

Month's Top Prices Hit in Grain Market

CHICAGO, Sept. 12 (AP)—Wheat futures advanced as much as a cent a bushel to the highest level in about a month today on active purchasing attributed to reports of government orders and export sales.

Other grains were strong with wheat, although rye reacted on profit-taking after the September delivery had reached a seasonal high of \$1.54 1/2.

There was an unconfirmed report from the east that the government had sold about 13,000,000 bushels of wheat to France, and another report said the government wanted between 1,500,000 and 2,000,000 sack of flour for

September and October shipment. Wheat closed 1/4 to 1 cent higher than the previous finish, September \$1.66 1/4, corn was up 1/4 to 1/2, December \$1.15, oats were 1/4 to 1/2 cent higher, September \$1.80 1/2, rye was 1/4 to 1/2 cent higher, September \$1.53 1/2, and barley was up 1/4 to 1/2, September \$1.10 1/4.
